

**AMENDMENT NO. 11 TO THE  
INTERLOCAL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN THE CITY OF STOCKTON AND  
COUNTY OF SAN JOAQUIN FOR THE  
EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT  
PROGRAM AWARD**

This Amendment No. 11 to the Interlocal Memorandum of Understanding Between the City of Stockton and County of San Joaquin for the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program Award (MOU) is made and entered into on \_\_\_\_\_, between the City of Stockton, California, a municipal corporation (lead agency for funding distribution) acting by its governing body, the Stockton City Council (“STOCKTON”), and the County of San Joaquin, California, acting by its governing body, the San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors (“COUNTY”) (collectively referred to as “RECIPIENTS”).

**RECITALS**

WHEREAS, RECIPIENTS agreed that the intent of the MOU was to make every effort in creating and sustaining a Firearms Reduction Consortium program during federal fiscal years 2011, 2012, and 2013, in accordance with the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program award; and

WHEREAS, RECIPIENTS agreed to extend the Firearms Reduction Consortium program during the additional federal fiscal years of 2014, 2015, 2016, in accordance with the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program award; and

WHEREAS, RECIPIENTS agreed to extend the Firearms Reduction Consortium program during the additional federal fiscal years of 2017, 2018, 2019, in accordance with the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program award; and

WHEREAS, RECIPIENTS agreed to extend the Firearms Reduction Consortium program during the additional federal fiscal years of 2020, 2021, and 2022, in accordance with the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program award; and

WHEREAS, for fiscal year 2022, STOCKTON will distribute the proceeds of the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program award for the Recipient programs as identified in Attachment A;

NOW THEREFORE, RECIPIENTS agree as follows:

1. The allocation of Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funds for fiscal year 2022 shall be distributed as set forth in Attachment A.
2. All other provisions of the MOU remain the same.
