# STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

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## **RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT THREE TO THE FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH THE EASTSIDE RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT**

The City of Stockton (City) has entered into Fire Protection Services Agreement with the Eastside Rural Fire Protection District (District) whereby residents within the District pay the City for fire protection and related services from the City's Fire Department; and

Payment for those services is calculated using a formula established by the Agreements based on the Fire Department's actual expenditures for a given fiscal year and "Gross Taxable Property Values" including the full assessed value of properties within the City regardless of whether the properties are within a redevelopment area; and

The parties to the Agreement now wish to amend the Agreement. The City shall staff the fire engine company at Station 12 (4010 East Main Street) with a crew of four (4) firefighters on each shift, which is above the City's current standard practice of three (3) firefighters per engine company. District shall be responsible for all costs incurred by the City to hire, train, equip, and employ the additional personnel. The obligation imposed by Amendment Three shall accrue at the conclusion of the first City firefighter training academy held after the execution of the Amendment; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council approves the Third Amendment to the Fire Protection Services Agreement with the Eastside Rural Fire Protection District as set forth in Exhibit 1, attached and incorporated by this reference.

2. The City Council approves the allocation of three (3) District funded firefighter positions, increasing the Fire Department's total number of authorized full-time positions from 239 to 242.

3. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to establish revenue estimates and corresponding budget appropriations associated to this Third Amendment in General Fund Fire Department accounts in FY 2022-23.

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4. The City Manager is authorized and to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
