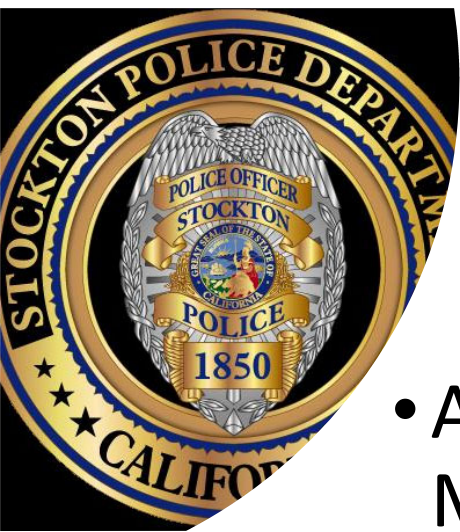
- IBIS Entries made by SPD NIBIN Technicians
