James Young spoke in support for the appointment of Kurt Wilson as City Manager; suggested sidewalk ramps at Pershing and Swain and Pershing and Douglas; clean up of leaves covering potholes; would like to help the Police and Fire Departments

Sheila James shared an unsettling situation that she experienced at her home involving the police department that she perceived as excessive show of force; concerned about adequate training of 911 operators and officers regarding racial profiling

Cynthia Gail Boyd commended the Police Department for the gunshot detection program; suggested it be used north of Martin Luther King Boulevard; suggested active recruitment efforts to seek more African-American Police Officers; related experience when officers inappropriately responded to her residence because a neighbor said she was threatening with scissors; suggested Officers and Dispatchers get better training; questioned why panhandlers continue to harass customers in the downtown area

Matt Miller, former Intern for the City of Stockton conducted the active research project from August 1-25, 2013 using art, design, technology, and organization to solicit community opinion on the most important things to reinvent in the City; the responses included the following categories: 1) Social/Physical Safety 489 mentions 2) Community Development 421 mentions 3) Economic Development 221 mentions 4) Good Government 192 mentions 5) Natural/Environmental Resources 30 mentions; top ten themes were: 1) crime 2) transportation quality 3) blight 4) youth 5) human capital 6) civic involvement 7) schools 8) employment opportunity 9) housing insecurity 10) bankruptcy; suggested that this type of community based action/research continue to occur; is thankful for the opportunity to conduct the survey and inspired to continue in public service

LaCresia Hawkins, California Center for Public Health Advocacy and Charlotte Dixon, Sr. Policy Director Northern California, in conjunction with NAACP Stockton Branch, announced a new funding opportunity to help create healthy environments for residents of San Joaquin County (presentation and document filed) through the Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) Project; extended congratulations to City Manager Wilson on behalf of Bobby Bivens

Councilmember Holman inquired about possible collaboration with Farmers Market

Councilmember Tubbs inquired about the Heal Cities campaign and if that is something that will be continued; the Legislative Environmental Committee interested in looking at health and healthy eating options in the City and is hopeful that they can meet closely with the Center to come up with some policies
