**PUBLIC HEARING: RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO THE 2020-2025 CONSOLIDATED PLAN, 2020-2021 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN, AND CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PLAN; ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE CARES ACT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS AND EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT (ESG) FUNDS**

On January 31, 2020, COVID-19 was declared a Public Health Emergency by the United States. On March 4, 2020, California Governor, Gavin Newsom, like other states, declared a State of Emergency to begin making resources available to the state to combat COVID-19, and

On March 12, 2020, San Joaquin County declared a Public Health Emergency in response to COVID-19, and the City Manager Harry Black signed a Proclamation of the Existence of a Local Emergency to respond to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency, and

On March 27, 2020, in response to the pandemic outbreak of the coronavirus disease COVID-19 the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (the CARES Act), a \$2.2 trillion stimulus aid package was signed into law by the President of the United States to provide relief to individuals suffering from the economic impacts of COVID-19 and to provide funds to states, local governments, businesses, and other entities to help, and

The City of Stockton was allocated a combined \$9,066,890 of supplemental CDBG-CV and ESG-CV CARES Act funding to assist low-income households, homeless persons, and small businesses during this COVID-19 period, and

A requirement to accessing the CARES Act funding, the City must substantially amend its Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-2025 Consolidated Plan (Exhibit 1 - Con Plan), its FY 2020-2021 Annual Action Plan (Exhibit 2 - Action Plan), and its Citizen Participation Plan (Exhibit 3 – Citizen Participation Plan). The Consolidated Plan Amendment will include disaster support language in the event of a future local, state, or national disaster emergency, such as the COVID-19 pandemic. The Annual Action Plan Amendment documents the proposed CDBG-CV and ESG-CV1 and CV2 activity allocations of \$9,066,890 in CARES Act funding; and the Citizen Participation Amendment allows for a five (5) day public comment period and the ability to hold virtual hearings per the waiver of the federal regulations, and

The City of Stockton is an entitlement jurisdiction that receives an annual allocation of CDBG and ESG funding. The City received notification that it has been

allocated \$2,016,786 of CDBG-CV CARES Act funding and \$7,050,104 of ESG-CV1 and CV2 CARES Act funding to assist Stockton's low-income residents, homeless population, and small businesses during this pandemic period; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Approve the 2020-2025 Consolidated Plan, 2020-2021 Annual Action Plan, and the City's Citizen Participation Plan amendments, incorporated herein as Exhibits 1, 2, and 3 respectfully for submission to the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

2. Approve and accept the CARES Act CDBG-CV1 funding allocation of \$2,016,786 and the ESG-CV1 and CV2 allocation of \$7,050,104 for a combined CARES Act funding total of \$9,066,890 and authorize the execution of the Cares Act Agreement with the HUD to accept grant funding.

3. Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to execute all required documents and forward them to HUD.

4. Authorize the City Manager to reallocate funds among approved activities and partners as needed to maximize impact and benefit to the Stockton community.

5. Approve and authorize the City Manager, or designee, to appropriate grant funds and associated expenditures, execute contracts above the current \$75,000 spending cap for funds accepted under this Resolution, and to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
