City Clerk, Bonnie Paige noted the receipt of Mr. Leiba's letter; it has been circulated around the bench; noting that the letter would be made part of the permanent record (document filed)

Ned Leiba Document

Vanessa Burke, CFO clarified and responded to the letter received from Ned Leiba

CFO, Vanessa Burke explained that work on next CAFR will be complete in March and staff will report out to council in April; regarding the release of draft financial statements, in compliance with 15C212 Security Exchange Commission (SEC) we must release information as it becomes publicly available; if draft information is released prior to public release it could become subject to SEC litigation

Vice Mayor Canepa asked for clarification regarding unfunded liabilities; internal service fund; workers compensation

CFO. Vanessa Burk shared with the Council the unfunded liabilities as of June 30, 2011 unfunded liabilities as follows: Public Safety Plan has an unfunded amount of \$117 million dollars and is 85.4% funded Miscellaneous Plan, which includes the rest of City staff, has an unfunded amount of \$54.9 million dollars and is 90.4% funded. Small Closed PARS Plan for Municipal Utilities has an unfunded amount of \$5 million dollars and is 40% funded Post-Retirement Benefit Plan has an unfunded amount of \$416.7 million dollars and is 0 % funded Due to bankruptcy filing the Post- Retirement Health Benefits unfunded amount will decrease; negotiating tentative settlement; other liabilities will be recorded in future financial statements per GASB68 In terms of workers compensation current claims are being paid, prior claims have an unfunded balance of \$44 million dollars; finding in Auditor's Management Letter recommends that staff return to Council with a plan to pay off the \$44 million dollars in unfunded workers compensation claims over time

Mayor Silva inquired about comparison to other cities audits; regarding financial weaknesses identified is there a recommendations for moving forward

Ken Pun, Pun & McGeady explained that due to the bankruptcy and dissolution of the Redevelopment Agency the audit has been difficult; audit firm is comfortable with issuing a clean audit opinion; in terms of moving forward the auditing firm looked into the causes of weakness and provided a plan for staff consideration

Councilmember Miller underscores where the city was leading up to bankruptcy filing; happy to be getting 2013 CAFR; thanked staff and Audit Committee for work done

Vice Mayor Canepa asked CFO, Vanessa Burke to discuss process of work done and issues with lack of staffing CFO, Vanessa Burke shared frustration with antiquated financial system and lack of manpower; explained that staff works tirelessly to complete reports in lieu of running day to day operations

Councilmember Burgos Medina thanked staff for work done by Audit Committee and financial staff

Councilmember Holman thanked staff; General Fund reporting showed that the City would not have made payroll July 2012 without filing for bankruptcy

Vice Mayor Canepa noted publicly that he spoke with Mr. Hakeem outside of current meeting

Mike Hakeem, attorney representing applicant spoke in opposition to the denial

Mayor Silva asked City Attorney John Luebberke for clarification regarding possible Council action per Stockton Municipal Code

City Attorney, John Luebberke explained the need for a vote of 5 in favor of approving the appeal of the Planning Commission's denial

Vice Mayor Canepa spoke to previous Council appeal decisions; expressed the need to establish set policy within the City; suggested

possible referral to Legislative Environmental Committee

Councilmember Holman inquired about length of ownership at current location and current license; complaints on current location

Councilmember Miller disclosed conversation with Mr. Hakeem prior to meeting; asked for clarification regarding existing licenses; when type 21 was open were there increased calls to the Police Department; referenced map for existing type 21 licenses; questioned distance to travel to next type 21; does not feel that this is an over concentration of type 21 establishments in area

Community Development Deputy Director Forrest Ebbs clarified that although there was a high volume of calls to Stockton Police Department, the fact that the type 21 establishment in question was a department store, a majority of calls to the Police Department were for shoplifting, which is normal for an establishments like that

Councilmember Burgos Medina inquired about standard concentration in census tract and ratio of types of licenses; is there an increase in crime or calls to Police Department when establishments change from type 20 to 21

Community Development Deputy Director Forrest Ebbs explained that per capita the City of Stockton has 2.4 times the recommended alcohol sales than surrounding cities; possible training for establishment owners/managers

Councilmember Zapien spoke to the standard for review; disclosed prior conversation with Mr. Hakeem; asked for clarification as to what the Planning Commission heard with the first presentation

City Attorney John Luebberke noted that Municipal Code establishes voting threshold

Councilmember Holman disclosed prior conversation with Mr. Hakeem; is there a defined criterion in place to revoke permit

Councilmember Miller spoke to floor space limitation

Gary Malloy shared his experience at Rite Aide

Cynthia Gail Boyd asked for clarification regarding hours of operation; expressed concern for saturation in her area

Anthony Burgher spoke in support of advancement; expressed concern of the value that would be added

Councilmember Holman encouraged everyone to attend the Martin Luther King Celebration at the Civic Auditorium starting Sunday at 6:00 p.m., Monday 7:00 a.m. breakfast, and Youth Rally in the afternoon; one of the strengths of Stockton is its diversity of cultures

Councilmember Zapien thanked everyone who participated in the Wilson Way Neighborhood Initiative Watch kick-off on January 4th; encouraged anyone associated with a community based organization in a position to offer services to residents in that area to contact him or the Stockton Police Department

Councilmember Miller wished everyone a Happy New Year, reported that water conservation was discussed at Water Committee meeting, and Municipal Utilities has a plan for water conservation measures that will go through the Committee very soon; thanked everyone in the community who participated in collecting donations for the under-privileged in December; thanked staff and public for messages of condolences in the passing of her 87 year old Stepfather

Councilmember Burgos Medina extended her condolences to Councilmember Miller; suggested the Legislative/Environmental Committee address the number of liquor stores in the City; thanked Councilmember Tubbs for his leadership with the Leadership Training at Maya Angelou Library over the Winter Break; plans to attend the Martin Luther King event on Sunday; noted crab feed

season, encouraged everyone to support a good cause and attend one
