RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE APPROPRIATION OF \$1,000,000 FROM FY 2023-24 YEAR-END DISCRETIONARY FUNDS FOR COUNCIL PRIORITY PROJECTS

The City of Stockton developed the Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program to address safety, noise, and quality of life issues caused by vehicle traffic on neighborhood streets. The program offers a formal process for implementing traffic calming measures and includes a toolbox of potential solutions; and

The Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program, Project No. WT16008, anticipates construction for Fiscal Year 2025-26, and reflects eight locations currently in design phase, to address traffic areas across the City; and

The Gospel Center Rescue Mission Incorporated, a 501(c)(3) organization located in Stockton, California, is dedicated to serving the homeless and addicted population of San Joaquin County. The mission focuses on long-term recovery, offering support through addiction treatment, medical care, and spiritual guidance; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Authorize the transfer of \$850,000 from the City Council Discretionary funds to the Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program (NTMP), Project No. WT16008.
2. Authorize the transfer of \$150,000 from the City Council Discretionary funds to the Gospel Center Rescue Mission Incorporated, a 501(c)(3) organization to assist in their funding shortfall. An agreement with Gospel Center Rescue Mission Incorporated will be executed with Council approval at a future date.
3. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
