STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT BETWEEN SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY AND CITY OF STOCKTON IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,356,782, FOR CALIFORNIA ASSEMBLY BILL 109 (AB 109) FUNDING OF THE COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PARTNERSHIP TASK FORCE, AND THE AMENDMENT OF THE FISCAL YEAR 2022-23 ANNUAL BUDGET

The Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) of San Joaquin County formed a Task Force in 2012 to support the premise of prison realignment; and

The Task Force uses the Problem Oriented Policing (POP) model focusing on offenders who are wanted for a new crime or compliance violation, have a history of violence, are repeat offenders or are at high risk of becoming repeat offenders; and

The Task Force serves each of the cities within San Joaquin County based on identified need; and

Since 2012, funding allocated through AB 109 to San Joaquin County has been applied for and awarded to support the core team members of the Task Force; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Independent Contractor Agreement between San Joaquin County and the City of Stockton, for AB 109 funding of the CCP Task Force, is hereby approved.
- 2. The City Manager, as Fiscal Agent for the law enforcement agencies of San Joaquin County, is authorized to accept \$1,356,782 in Fiscal Year 2022-23 Police Grant Funds.
- 3. The Fiscal Year 2022-23 Annual Budget is amended to appropriate \$1,356,782 in revenues and expenditures for the Police Grants and Special Programs CCP Task Force accounts as needed to carry out the purpose and intent of this action.
