# STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

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## RESOLUTION APPROVING THE NOTICE OF EXEMPTION NO. CE002-17, APPROVING THE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS AND AWARDED A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT TO GREENTECH INDUSTRY, INC. FOR THE FIRE STATION NO. 2 BURN ROOM RESTORATION (PROJECT NO. PW1503)

On December 1, 2016, the City Clerk of the City of Stockton opened, examined, and publicly declared the sealed proposals or bids offered for the Fire Station No. 2 Burn Room Restoration (Project No. PW1503); and

The project will ensure that future training fires in the Burn Room will not damage the concrete wall by installing new fire brick in front of the walls, fire resistant tiles on the ceiling, and metal doors in openings to help control the fire; and

Greentech Industry, Inc., is the apparent low bidder in the amount of \$106,140; and

Greentech Industry, Inc., is the lowest bidder in the amount of \$106,140, because its bid is regular and responsive in all respects; and

This project is exempt from the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) as specified under Article 19, Section 15301, Class 1, of the CEQA Guidelines, because this is a discretionary project under the City's jurisdiction and qualifies as a project which has been determined to not have a significant effect on the environment; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Manager is authorized to approve the filing of Notice of Exemption No. CE002-17 under CEQA for the Fire Station No. 2 Burn Room Restoration (Project No. PW1503), a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.
2. The City Council approves the plans and specifications for the Fire Station No. 2 Burn Room (Project No. PW1503).
3. A Construction Contract between the City of Stockton and Greentech Industry, Inc., in the amount of \$106,140, is hereby awarded, and the City Manager is authorized and directed to execute same, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 2 and incorporated by this reference.

4. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take appropriate and necessary actions to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
