RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE UPDATED 2020 SPHERE OF INFLUENCE/ MUNICIPAL SERVICES REVIEW REPORT FOR SUBMITTAL TO THE SAN JOAQUIN LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION

On December 4, 2018, the Stockton City Council approved the Envision Stockton 2040 General Plan. The updated General Plan identified the City's urban growth boundaries and land use within those boundaries; and

On February 14, 2019, the San Joaquin Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) approved an interim 2019 Sphere of Influence/Municipal Services Review (SOI/MSR) based on the Stockton 2035 General Plan. The interim 2019 SOI/MSR was needed to address an annexation request that came in prior to the adoption of the Envision Stockton 2040 General Plan. Completion of the 2040 General Plan land use assumption was needed in order to update the SOI/MSR; and

An adopted SOI/MSR is needed to assist in the annexation of private annexation requests and to monitor the status of services within the City's boundaries. While the interim Report was needed to accommodate an annexation request, a final SOI/MSR report must be adopted by the City Council and submitted to LAFCO for approval as required by State Law; and

Development contained within the updated SOI/MSR is consistent with the City's 2040 General Plan and the previous interim Report. The City prepared an updated SOI/MSR and desires to complete the updated SOI/MSR to ensure services can be maintained within all of the City's boundaries; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS
FOLLOWS:**

1) The City Council accepts the updated 2020 Sphere of Influence/Municipal Service Review report, attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.

2) The City Council find and determines that the updated Report does not require further analysis under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) section 15183, for projects which are consistent with the development density established by a Community Plan, General Plan, or Zoning for which an environmental impact report (EIR) has been certified. An EIR was prepared and certified by the City Council as part of the Stockton General Plan (SCH# 2017052062).
