To <u>Otto Construction</u> (Contractor). You are hereby directed to make the herein described changes from the plans and specifications or do the following described work not included in the plans and specifications of this contract.

EXTRA WORK AT FORCE ACCOUNT

In accordance with Section 4-1.05A "Changes and Extra Work – General" of the City of Stockton Standard Specifications, the Contractor was directed to provide the following additional items of work:

1) PROVIDE ADDITIONAL WELDING AND FABRICATION TO ATTACH THE EXISTING BASKETBALL BACKBOARD TO THE EXISTING BASKETBALL POLE. PROVIDE A NEW HOOP AND NET FOR THE HALF BASKETBALL COURT.

The existing basketball backboard required additional fabrication to mount to the existing pole at the half basketball court. A new hoop and net were needed. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 113)

EXTRA WORK AT AGREED LUMP SUM

In accordance with Section 4-1.05A of the City of Stockton Standard Specifications, the Contractor is directed to provide the following additional items of work:

1) PROVIDE THE ELECTRONIC HARDWARE REVISIONS INCLUDED IN ASI #6, ELECTRONIC HARDWARE FOR THE POOL ENTRANCE GATE, LOUVRES IN DOORS 105 AND 106 WITH VANDAL RESISTANT GRATES COATED WITH EPOXY PAINT.

Electronic door and gate hardware was necessary to provide proper access control during normal building operation. Louvers were necessary on the doors to the chemical rooms to comply with current code requirements. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 72R2)

Agreed Lump Sum Price: \$14,295.44

2) PROVIDE BROADLEAF ABATEMENT, GRADING TO REPAIR ANIMAL DAMAGE FILLING VOIDS AND BURROWS TO A SMOOTH SURFACE, HYDROSEEDING, AND SOIL AMENDMENT TO ACHIEVE 95% GERMINATION OF NEW TURF GRASSES ON AN ADDITIONAL APPROXIMATELY 8.5 ACRES OF TURF. PROVIDE A LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE PERIOD OF 120 DAYS AS PER THE CONTRACT SPECIFICATIONS ON THE ADDITIONAL 8.5 ACRES OF TURF.

The existing turf has deteriorated due to invasive broadleaf vegetation. The turf area is found to be uneven and unsafe for public use due to squirrel and other animal activity and through general use over the years. This treatment is intended to provide a safe walkable turf surface for the enjoyment of the public. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 99)

3) INSTALL ADDITIONAL MORTAR AND $\frac{1}{4}$ INCH STAINLESS STEEL RODS TO BUILD THE EXISTING POOL BOND BEAM UP TO THE PROPER ELEVATION.

The existing pool bond beam was found to be 2-1/2 inches lower than anticipated. It was necessary for the contractor to provide and install additional thickset mortar and stainless-steel reinforcement to bring the bond beam to the proper elevation. This change compensates the contractor for the additional costs to perform this work. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 108)

Agreed Lump Sum Price: \$9,611.92

4) PROVIDE UPGRADES TO THE EXISTING RESTROOM BUILDING.

The existing restroom building required improvements to meet current codes. Improvements include new lighting, paint, epoxy flooring, toilet partitions, and plumbing drains. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 110)

Agreed Lump Sum Price: \$95,947.45

5) REIMBURSEMENT FOR A CITY ENCROACHMENT PERMIT FEE THAT WAS PAID FOR BY THE CONTRACTOR.

The Contract documents state that encroachment permit fees will be paid by the city. This item reimburses the contractor for the encroachment permit fee. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 111)

Agreed Lump Sum Price: \$620.85

6) RESURFACE THE EXISTING HANDBALL COURT.

The existing handball court surface was not level and not usable as a playing surface. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 112)

Agreed Lump Sum Price: \$13,079.00

7) PAINT THE WOOD PORTION OF THE NEW SOFTBALL BACKSTOP.

Applying paint to the wood portion of the backstop will potentially extend the usable life of the backstop. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 114)

Agreed Lump Sum Price: \$3,110.80

8) REMOVE AND REPLACE THE EXISTING EXPANSION JOINT MATERIAL AT THE EXISTING TENNIS COURT AREA.

The existing tennis courts were found to include expansion joints that were not addressed on the contract documents. It was necessary to clean and fill the joints with sealant to provide an acceptable substrate for the new sports court surface. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 116)

Agreed Lump Sum Price: \$7,513.00

9) PROVIDE A STAINLESS-STEEL SECURITY STOP FOR THE PASS-THROUGH TRANSACTION TRAY AT THE TICKET WINDOW.

A security stop at the ticket window is necessary to prevent access to the ticket office through the security tray. This additional work does not affect the critical path schedule and, therefore, does not include any additional working days. (FOD 117)

Agreed Lump Sum Price: \$793.10
