The City did not receive any proposals on the November 7, 2016, due date. City staff inquired with potential consultants as to why they were not interested in the project. The City received the following response: lack of experience with federally funded projects, lack of experience with high surface treatment and difficulty meeting DBE goal. The project was re-advertised on February 15, 2017. The City received one proposal submitted by CSG Consultants Inc on the March 15, 2017, due date. The selection committee comprised of Traffic Engineering and CIP Public Works staff reviewed the submitted proposal. The selection committee agreed that the proposal demonstrated the necessary knowledge, experience and staff to design the project. City staff considered original the fee proposal excessive for the scope, size, and complexity of the project compared with the independent cost estimate. City staff has negotiated a scope and fee with CSG Consultants Inc that meets City expectations for the project. It is in the best interest of the City to move forward and secure the design contract as re-advertising for a third time would expend additional unnecessary funds.
