RESOLUTION IMPLEMENTING PEG (PUBLIC, EDUCATIONAL & GOVERNMENTAL) SUPPORT FEE WITH STATE VIDEO FRANCHISE SERVICE PROVIDERS WITHIN THE CITY OF STOCKTON

On March 13, 2012, the Stockton City Council approved Ordinance 2012-03-13-1601 CS, repealing Stockton Municipal Code (SMC) Chapter 11.24 Cable Television and adopting SMC Chapter 11.24 State Video Service Franchises, in compliance with the California Digital Infrastructure and Video Competition Act (DIVCA) of 2006; reserving local jurisdiction rights, recognizing state law, and authorizing a 1% PEG support fee; and

This action furthers the City Council's goals and objectives for improved public relations and image, government transparency, public engagement, investment in technology, and fiscal sustainability; and

A video service provider PEG fee is needed to replace and maintain facilities and equipment that will allow continued Government Access Channel broadcasting and programming; expand broadcasting and programming to all State video franchise service providers authorized to provide video (cable) services in Stockton; and provide a necessary funding source for capital costs associated with facilities and equipment; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council hereby approves the implementation of a PEG support fee equal to 1% of the gross revenues of all State video franchise service providers authorized to provide video services within the City of Stockton.
2. Amend the current Fiscal Year 2014-15 budget to increase revenues and expenditures by \$45,000 in separate accounts within 020-0134.
3. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take the appropriate actions to carry out the intent and purpose of this resolution.
