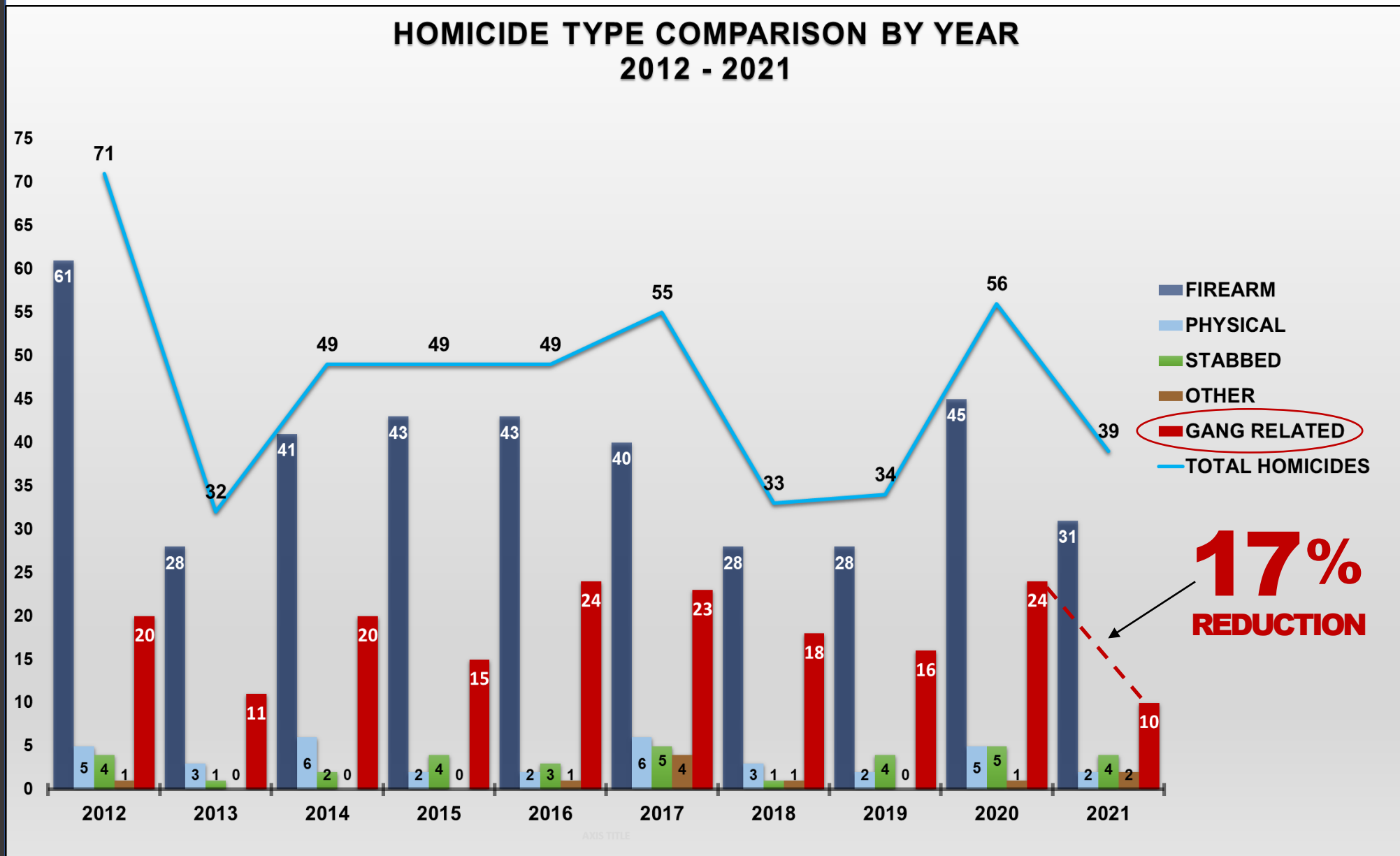

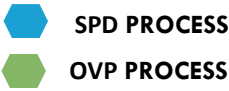

Ceasefire Process



Gang/Group Shooting Occurs

- SPD Patrol/Gang Unit & Investigation teams respond to shooting.
- Watch Commander notifies OVP of shooting incident.



SPD Response

Gang Unit/CRT & CIU mobilizes to gather intelligence & de-escalate conflict through enforcement.



Weekly SPD Shooting Review

Weekly Police Shooting & Homicide Review. Police track group-related violence into scorecard data that informs weekly enforcement/intervention plans.



Community Safety Meeting

Law enforcement, community members & intervention workers sit-down with high-risk young adults to inform them of their safety risk and offer them an opportunity for services and support.



Focused Enforcement

Focused enforcement on individuals/groups who continue to engage in gun violence.



OVP Response

- Peacekeeper response to shooting scene & hospital.
- Connect victim's family to services.
- Meets with victim to understand the root of conflict & connect to services.



Conflict Mediation

- OVP & community partners gather intelligence to understand conflict
- Peacekeepers & community partners work to de-escalate conflict through mediations



Weekly Coordination

- SPD shares weekly shootings & homicide data with OVP.
- SPD sends referrals to OVP of identified high-risk individuals
- OVP develops weekly intervention strategies



Intensive Life Coaching

- High-Risk individual volunteers to engage with OVP
- Peacekeeper builds a trusting relationship and provides services, opportunities & supports, leading to better outcomes for the individual.

1. REAL-TIME COMMUNICATION WITH TRAUMA DOCTORS AND STAFF

- COMMUNICATE WITH TRAUMA TEAM AROUND VICTIM'S CURRENT HEALTH STATUS
- INFORM TRAUMA TEAM OF CIRCUMSTANCES LEADING TO THE SHOOTING INCIDENT
- ASSIST TRAUMA DOCTOR WITH COMMUNICATING WITH THE FAMILY



2. ENGAGE FAMILY MEMBERS WITH SUPPORT AND RESOURCES

- CONSOLE FAMILY DURING STRESSFUL SITUATION
- INFORM FAMILY OF COMMUNITY RESOURCES
- FIND KEY INFLUENTIAL FAMILY MEMBERS TO HELP REDUCE ESCALATION OF VIOLENCE



3. INTERVENTION WITH VICTIM AND ASSESS RISK LEVEL

- BUILD RELATIONSHIP WITH VICTIM
- ASSESS THE CORE ISSUE
- OFFER VICTIM PRE-DISCHARGE SUPPORT AND PLANNING
- OFFER WRAPAROUND SERVICES

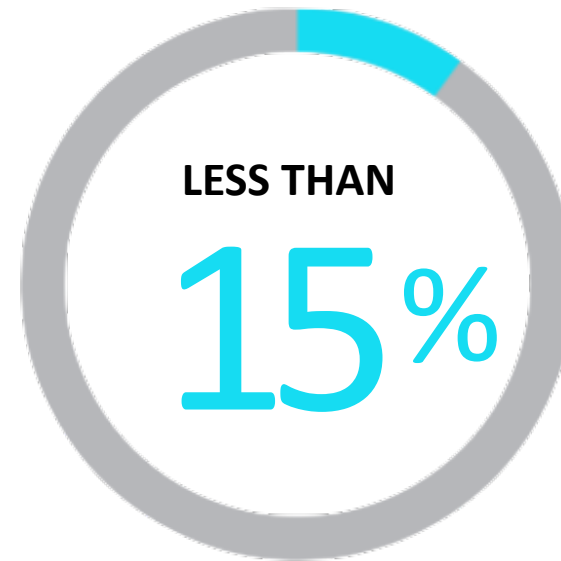

CLIENT 1

Life Before:

- Active gang member
- 11 years in prison
- Violent history with a gun including drug sales and robbery.
- Shot someone and has been shot at



ACHIEVEMENTS IN 6 MONTHS

Life After:

- Built trusting relationship with his Peacekeeper
- Participated in tattoo removal of gang sign
- Obtained his GED
- Obtained his birth certificate, social security card, and Driver's License
- A role-model to his daughter
- Employed doing construction
- Left the gang lifestyle
- Surrounds himself with positive influences



CLIENT 2

Life Before:

- Active gang member
- Burglary and theft
- Drug and gun charges



ACHIEVEMENTS IN 6 MONTHS



Life After:

- Attended a Call-in
- Secured employment earning \$22 per hr. and will be off probation soon.
- Obtained, birth certificate, social security card, and driver's license.
- Living a safe, healthy, and non-violent life with his girlfriend
- Attending a Cognitive Behavioral classes
- Utilizing financial services for credit repair to purchase a new home

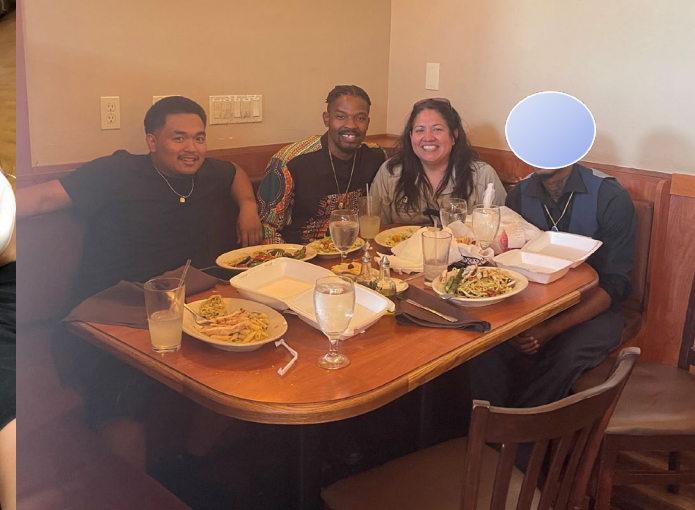
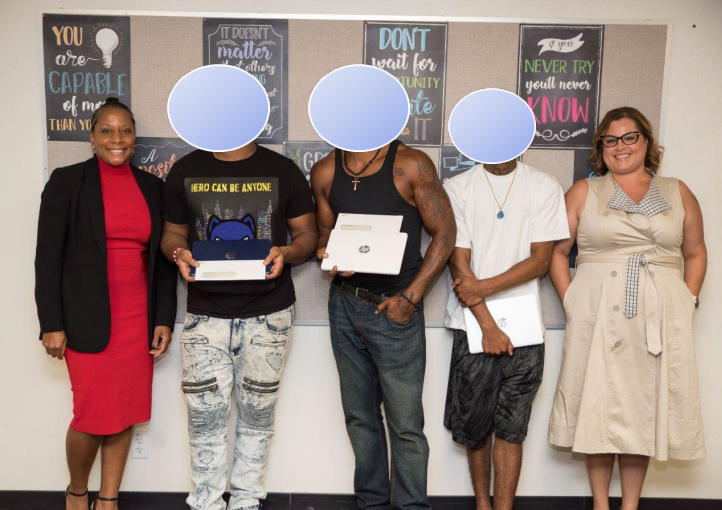




CLIENT 3

Life Before:

- Active gang member
- Has been shot at – including his friends
- Brother was killed
- Struggled in high-school and getting in trouble.
- Became young father of 3
- Went to county jail and was on probation



ACHIEVEMENT

Life After:

- Completed Cognitive Behavioral classes – built confidence to go for his dreams and gave him a safe space
- Obtained his Driver's License back.
- OVP Scholars participant - enrolled at Delta College studying Psychology
- Works full-time at Tesla
- Spoke at Attorney General site visit
- Assists OVP with community events



CLIENT 4

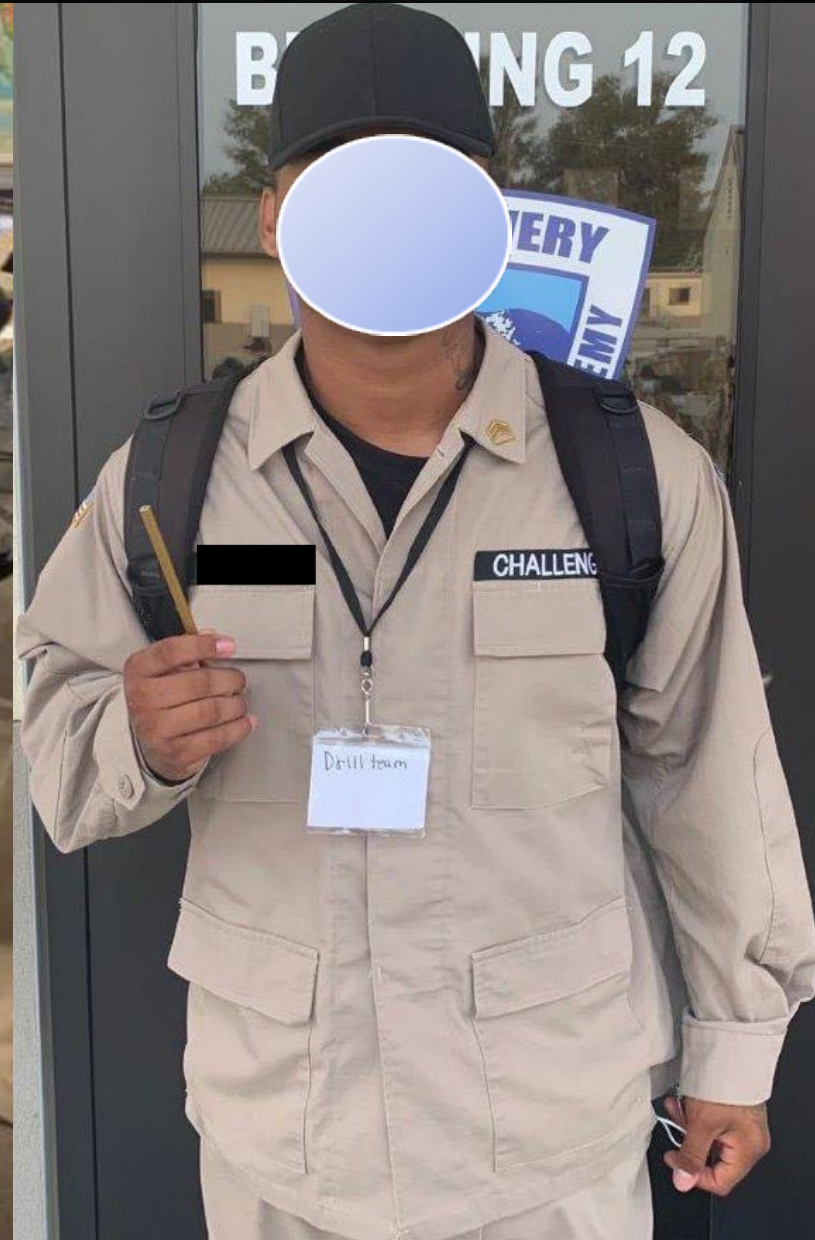
Life Before:

- Active generational gang member
- Violent history
- Arrested for firearms
- Was critical part in an active group conflict

ACHIEVEMENTS

Life After:

- Attended Cognitive Behavioral classes
- Obtained Driver's License, ID, and Birth Certificate
- Admitted into the Discovery Challenge Academy
- Tattoo Removal
- Graduated from the 6-month military academy in Lathrop, CA in December 2021



BEING PURPOSEFUL IN 2022 – ADDRESSING WELLNESS

- OVP will continue to carry out Operation Ceasefire strategies that have produced multi-year, community-wide reductions in gang/gun violence.
 - ❖ Emergency response to gang/gun incidents as they occur
 - ❖ Conflict mediation
 - ❖ Communicating with high-risk individuals to offer services, opportunities, and support
 - ❖ Provide intensive life coaching- **Enhanced**
 - ✓ Increase wellness and resilience through trauma-informed practice.

2022 DATA – PAST 90 DAYS

- ❖ **OVP shooting responses- 19**
 - ❖ Emergency relocation- 4
- ❖ **Conflict mediation- 5**
- ❖ **Communicating with high-risk individuals- 14**
 - ❖ 14 Safety meetings held.
 - ❖ Of the 14, 36% are represented on SPD's 3-month score card, groups most active in the past 90 days.
- ❖ **Communicating with the community-30**
 - ❖ OVP staff attended over 30 community events to support families.
- ❖ **Provide intensive life coaching-**
 - ❖ Active caseload – 61
 - ❖ 14 of which were added in the past 90 days.
