# STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

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## **RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING AND TRANSFERRING FUNDING, AWARDING A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT FOR THE SYSTEMIC PEDESTRIAN SAFETY ENHANCEMENTS, PROJECT NO. WT23041/FEDERAL PROJECT NO. HSIPL-5008(209)**

On June 26, 2024, the City advertised a Request for Proposals (RFP) for design services for the Systemic Pedestrian Safety Enhancements, Project No. WT23041/Federal Project No. HSIPL-5008(209). Two proposals were received; and

W-Trans was the more qualified and higher-ranked firm and was determined to be the most qualified firm for this project. Staff negotiated a fee in the amount of \$308,586.24 with W-Trans for design services; and

In November 2023, the Systemic Pedestrian Safety Enhancements, Project No. WT23041/Federal Project No. HSIPL-5008(209), was awarded federal Cycle 11 Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funding from Caltrans for design services. This project is 90 percent federally funded and requires a local match in the amount of \$51,260.00; and

Appropriation and transfer of funds is needed to fund all remaining costs to complete the design services and staff costs; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The City Council approves the appropriation of HSIP funds in the amount of \$461,340.00 to the Systemic Pedestrian Safety Enhancements, Project No. WT23041/Federal Project No. HSIPL-5008(209).

2. The City Council approves the transfer of funds in the amount of \$51,260.00 from Grant Match, Project No. WT21016, to the Systemic Pedestrian Safety Enhancements, Project No. WT23041/Federal Project No. HSIPL-5008(209).

3. The City Council approves findings pursuant to Stockton Municipal Code (SMC) Section 3.68.070 in support of an exception to the competitive bidding process. These findings include:

A. The City does not have sufficient staff and expertise to design this project.

- B. Use of the RFP process is appropriate for this Professional Services Contract because it relies on the evaluation of professional qualifications and performance as the basis for selection of a vendor. Use of the criteria helps ensure selection of a vendor that will provide the highest quality professional service, which is in the public interest.
- C. The City negotiated a contract following solicitation of competitive proposals in accordance with SMC Section 3.68.070.A.3.

4. The City Council awards a Professional Services Contract between the City of Stockton and W-Trans, in the amount of \$308,586.24, and the City Manager is authorized and directed to execute same, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.

5. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
