7. STAFF REPORTS

7.1 Reed: Parks Update

- Park Maintenance – overall the parks are in good condition. However, the City is experiencing seasonal issues regarding homelessness in two different parks, specifically with restrooms at Dentoni and Gibbons Parks; they are both closed while they are being maintained.
- Exeloo Restrooms – the City installed four Exeloo Restrooms at Victory Park, Oak Park, Fremont Park, and Stribley Park, and they are all open and operational.

- Stockton Soccer Complex – the city workers sprayed herbicide weed control on the fields and hoping to have a good result in the next few weeks. The park contractors will start mowing as of April 1, 2021. Currently, they are picking up trash seven days a week in the park.
 - Sousa Pool – inspection report showed that the bottom of the pool has a crack. An outside contractor is evaluating the issue will report back next month with the repair options.

7.2 Wright: Recreation Update

- Recreation Statistics
 - ❖ Food Distribution – we served over 4500 meals the last month through distribution sites.
 - ❖ Recreation Facebook - With our enhanced post on Facebook, we see percentages go up and viewership, likes, and engagements last month. We have 36 total posts. Those posts reached 12,638 individuals. Our page likes went up to 132%, reach is up 40%, and engagement 22%.
- Drive-in Movie - Community Services Department conducted the 1st Drive-in Movie on Friday, March 19, 2021, behind Weberstown Mall. There were 130 cars and a total of 402 attendees. Everything we received from staff and interaction from the public was all positive, and no incidents at all, and staff is looking forward to the 2nd Drive-in Movie on June 18, 2021.
- McNair High School Misty Holt-Singh Field – the Phase 2 CIP project budget at Misty Holt-Singh field is \$420,000. Public Works is expected to release bids in May. The project is to add dividing gates between the high school, softball fields, and the soccer complex. Install four scoreboards in the softball fields, rescinding the soccer fields to improve turf conditions, and adding a maintenance yard for staff to maintain both the Misty Holt-Singh Field and Softball Complex and surrounding complexes.
- COVID-19 Vaccination – the COVID-19 Vaccination in Stribley Community Center is still ongoing from Tuesday through Saturday. The City will collaborate with El Concilio, a local non-profit organization, to administer Vaccines for the two days when the County is off Sundays and Mondays.
- California Park and Recreation Society (CPRS) Conference – this week, eight full-time recreation employees will attend the Annual CPRS Virtual Conference. The virtual conference's nice feature is staff will have access to the sessions for 30 days after the conference. We plan to have more staff go through some of those key sessions that we think would help in terms of professional growth.
- Sports Complex and Fields – staff had contacted sports complex and field users and informed them about the plan to re-open on April 5, 2021, following the State guidelines implemented two weeks ago.
- Esports – this month, Recreation has the 1st ever NBA 2k Esports Tournament. The sign-ups have been extended through this week. The tournament will start from March 29 through April 10.

7.3 Jiang: Department Update

- Northeast Library and Community Center – staff, still don't have a date for the virtual groundbreaking.
 - Oak Park Tennis Center – City Council awarded the operator contract to Antwan Graves to operate the Tennis Complex for five years, effective April 1, 2021.
 - Former Van Buskirk Golf Course – the California Conservation Corps (CCC) continues to clean up the former golf course. There are big logs that need to be disposed of but are free if someone is interested.

Also, staff had contacted several cross country teams, specifically the Edison High School Coach. He's very excited about the opportunity to have the former golf course as a cross-country venue.

- Aquatics – the Strong Community Expenditure Plan has Victory Park Pool, and Oak Park Pool listed as projects. Public Works will oversee the projects and hope to begin in a year or two.

Sousa Pool opening might be delayed due to the crack in the bottom. Staff is on top of the situation so it can be fixed promptly.
- Recreation Facebook – everyone is encouraged to “like” the Recreation Facebook Page to expand our social media reach.
- SurveyMonkey – staff could now gather feedback every after programs or events they offer using SurveyMonkey to improve future programming.
- Pedometer Program - staff is starting a Pedometer Program beginning on April 11, 2021, the National Walking Day. This is a 12-week walking challenge to get residence up and moving in a fun and exciting way. Walkers are encouraged to download a Pedometer App on their phones to track their walking. Everyone must sign up at one of the City's Community Centers. The goal collectively is to walk 31 million steps.
- The City Council will vote and ratify the new Parks and Recreation Commissioner appointment on April 13, 2021.

9. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

9.1 School District COVID-19 Update

- Commissioner Nava provided the COVID-19 and in-person instruction update for Lodi Unified School District. On March 29, Lodi schools will be opened for in-person hybrid learning from K-6 and Special Needs students from K-12. There were 2,400 teachers and staff who got their first dose vaccine out of the 4,793 eligible employees. And 394 opt-out. Some teachers and staff will get their vaccination from their private doctors or other sources instead of the San Joaquin County Office of Education.
- Commissioner Jones provided the COVID-19 and in-person learning update for Lincoln Unified School District. The district had also started the in-person instruction in a hybrid passion on March 15 from Pre-K to 3rd grade and followed by 5th and 6th grade today. Commissioner Jones

hopes the 7 to 12 grades return on April 6, 2021. The district is allowing the cheerleading and band at their final football home games. Two parents or two family members per household are permitted to attend the sporting events. The majority of the teaching staff have gotten their 2nd dose vaccines. And in about a week or so, they should be fully vaccinated.

- Commissioner Duncan provided the COVID-19 and in-person instruction update for Manteca Unified School District. The district had started the hybrid in-person classes in November 2020 and the cohorts in late August of last year. Commissioner Duncan thanked the Superintendent and his cabinet for bringing a comprehensive plan and incorporating the CDPH and local guidelines so everyone is safe and students can continue in-person learning.
- Commissioner Mendez provided the COVID-19 and in-person instruction update for Stockton Unified School District. The school district is preparing for the in-person learning in alignment with the state requirement. The district is also working with bargaining units to make the transition smooth. The school district will also continue to offer distance learning as an option to the parents.

10. COMMENTS FROM COMMISSIONERS

- Lockwood – Commissioner Lockwood asked when is the budget committee going to meet?

Per Mr. Jiang, the staff is still working on the budget, and as soon as the budget is approved, he will present it to the Commission.

Commissioner Lockwood announced that tomorrow at 5:00 p.m., the Stockton Ports would have a virtual Town Hall Meeting. Also, Stockton Ports will start their 2021 regular season on May 4 through September 19.

- Duncan - Commissioner Duncan hopes the Recreation Centers will be opened soon so kids can participate actively in sports. Also, Mr. Duncan has started his track and field and basketball conditioning programs.
