7.1 Machado: Parks Update

Victor Machado, City Parks Manager, provided an update for the following:

- City Council has allocated discretionary funding for cricket at Anderson Park.
- Exeloo Restrooms are working well with minor vandalism and plumbing issues.
- An Arsonist vandalized the playground at Brotherhood Park.

The city has received several bids for the Stribley Ball Park Lighting Project, and City Council
will award the contract on June 22.

Comments or questions:

Commissioner Warmsley expressed her concerns about Brotherhood Park Playground mixing old equipment with new equipment. She hopes that replacing the playground structure will be a top priority within the city. She also mentioned the broken picnic table and benches at Brotherhood Park.

Mr. Machado shared that Public Works is in the process of removing and replacing the worn benches and tables in the park.

7.3 Jiang: Department Update

Stephen Jiang, Deputy Director, Recreation, provided the following update for Recreation and Community Services Department:

- Pixie Woods Pixie Woods is scheduled to re-open on June 5. Volunteers did some cleaning in the park, and the train is being repaired.
- Special Events The next Drive-In Movie is scheduled for June 18. The Concerts in the Park and Movie in the Point are expected to start in July.
- Community Centers The distant learning camp will end on May 28. Summer Day Camp will start on June 1. The Play in the Shade Program begins on June 7 at Panella Park, Stribley Park, Van Buskirk Park, and Weston Park. The Stockton Walk Program is still ongoing. The centers are expected to fully open in July.
- July is Parks & Recreation Month.
- The number of people getting appointment to be vaccinated at Stribley Center Clinic has declined.
- The California Conservation Corps (CCC) will continue to work at the former Van Buskirk Golf Course through the end of June.
- City and County Libraries are re-opening on June 15 to regular pre-pandemic schedules.
- The City Pools and Weber Point fountain will re-open on Memorial Day weekend.
- The City Budget Sessions starts on June 7. Community Services Department will find out this time what budgets are approve.

8. SCHOOL DISTRICTS AND COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION UPDATES

8.1 Stockton Unified School District Update

Commissioner Mendez provided the following updates and reports for Stockton Unified School District:

The district has started taking registration for the Summer School K-8 grade students. And this
is being offered in-person or virtual. Within the high school the focus is on credit recovery
advancement.

- The Career and Technical Education (CTE) Program will be held at Chavez High School in June. And in July at Health Career Academy, Weber Institute, and Merlo Institute. And at Delta College, they are hosting the Verizon Innovation Learning Program for upcoming middle school girls using hybrid model.
- The University of the Pacific and Reaching for the Stars Foundation's Summer Camp is focusing on Math skills.
- The Delta College is offering and inviting high school students to attend the public speaking, reading and comprehension, and history through film courses.
- All students will be receiving breakfast and lunch during summer school.
- There are no updates on SUSD pools if they are accessible and usable this summer.

8.2 Lincoln Unified School District Update

Commissioner Jones provided the following updates and reports for Lincoln Unified School District.

- Schools were back in in-person learning after Easter using the hybrid model.
- 70% of the total population of the students are participating in in-person learning.
- The school district is offering summer school for all K-8 and middle school campuses.
- The high school graduation and promotion for 8th graders are going to be in-person. And each graduating student will get two tickets to the event. Also, the graduation and promotion will be live-streamed online so family and friends can watch the events.

8.3 Lodi Unified School District Update

Commissioner Nava provided the following updates and reports for Lodi Unified School District.

- The school district started in-person learning on April 12, five days a week. It is also offering distant education.
- 70%-80% is attending in-person learning.
- The first in-person graduation was held at Delta College campus on May 21 with 62 graduates.
- McNair High School also held in-person graduation. Lodi school district has offered McNair and Tokay High School stadiums for in-person graduation to Lodi High School and Beak Creek High School.
- The last day of school is June 10.
- Lodi School District had reached an agreement with Lodi Education Association on May 18.
 The union received their COLA, stipend for middle school chairs, and retirement plan for Lodi Unified School District Employees.

8.4 Manteca Unified School District Update

Commissioner Duncan provided the following updates and reports for Manteca Unified School

- The school district is offering the Summer Academy and is a specific program that focuses on foundational skills in math and English language arts for students in k-8 grade needing targeted instruction.
- The last week of school is this week.
- The 8th graders will have Drive-thru graduation. The high school will have two separate graduation ceremonies to mitigate social distancing.
