


City of Stockton Redistricting Map Selection



Step	Description
Initial Mtg (ARC) Aug 9	Education and to solicit input on the communities in the Districts.
Hearing 1 – Pre-Map (ARC) Aug 30	Education and to solicit input on the communities in the Districts.
California Data Release Sep – Oct	Census Bureau released 2020 Census population data Aug 12 in legacy format. California releases official 'prisoner-adjusted' data up to six weeks later. Waiting period to release maps, 1 or 3 weeks.
Two Draft Map Hearings (ARC) Oct 4 & Oct 11	Two Public Hearings to discuss and revise draft maps and to identify preferred map(s).
Hearing 2 – Post-Map (CC) Oct 12	Public Hearing to discuss and revise draft maps and to identify preferred map(s).
Hearing 3 – Post-Map (CC) Wed., Nov 10	Public Hearing to discuss draft maps and to adopt map and election sequencing.
Hearing 4 – Post-Map (CC) Dec 7	Public Hearing to discuss draft maps and to adopt map and election sequencing.
Map Adoption By Dec 15	Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption. Map adopted via ordinance.

FAIR MAPS Act

- Community of interest of the districts

3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

Minimize voters shifted to different election years

Respect voters' choices / continuity in office

Future population growth

Preserving the core of existing districts

Prohibited:

"Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."





Redistricting Rules and Goals

SECTION 202. Redistricting Standards.

- (a) The districts shall continue to be as nearly equal in population as may be according to the latest federal decennial census.
- (b) The districts shall comply with the applicable provisions of the United States Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, Section 1973 of Title 42 of the United States Code, as amended and any other applicable provisions of federal or state law.
- (c) In establishing the boundaries of the districts, the City may give consideration to the following factors: (1) topography, (2) geography, (3) cohesiveness, contiguity, integrity, and compactness of territory, and (4) community of interest of the districts.
- (d) Council districts shall be numbered sequentially with the Council District in the northeastern most section of the City numbered District 1. (Amended Election 11/8/16 effective 12/3/16)


ARTICLE 2. Chartered Cities [21620 - 21630] (Article 2 enacted by Stats. 1994, Ch. 920, Sec. 2.)

21626.

- (a) The term of office of any council member who has been elected and whose term of office has not expired shall not be affected by any change in the boundaries of the district from which the council member was elected.
- (b) At the first election for council members in each city following adoption of the boundaries of council districts, excluding a special election to fill a vacancy or a recall election, a council member shall be elected for each district under the new district plan that has the same district number as a district whose incumbent's term is due to expire. This subdivision does not apply when a city transitions from at-large to district-based elections.




Existing Districts




African-American CVAP

African-American Citizen Voting Age Population is concentrated in Districts 5 and 6




Asian-American **CVAP**


Asian-American Citizen Voting Age Population is concentrated in Districts 1 and 2





Latino CVAP

Latino Citizen Voting Age Population is concentrated in Districts 5 and 6, and southeast portion of District 4.


