

**Encampment Displacement Criteria****Fire**

High probability of fire to adjacent structures, or the presence of quantities of fuels or explosives

**Crime**

Evidence of criminal activity and crime trends related to the occupants of a specific encampment, determined using data driven analysis

**Critical Infrastructure**

Undermining/modifications to slopes or embankments  
Impeding required repair work, maintenance, or inspections  
Blocking traffic, bike, or pedestrian pathways which creates a danger to the unsheltered or the public  
Obstructing culverts, pipes, or other drainage systems  
Connecting to or tampering with a critical electrical supply

**Mitigation**

Set of conditions which collectively create an unsafe situation for the unsheltered or the public. The conditions may consist of, but are not limited to:

- Excessive and significant trash and debris creating potential risks to human life and safety
- Substantial accumulation of needles, feces, or other biohazards
- Considerable increase in the presence of rodents, animals, or insect infestations
- Consistent and on-going adverse conditions which create a substantial community concern
