RESOLUTION APPROVING FINDINGS, APPROVING THE PURCHASE REPLACEMENT OF ONE FIRE ENGINE FROM ROSENBAUER AMERICA IN THE AMOUNT OF \$503,018.07, AND AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2015-16 GENERAL INSURANCE INTERNAL SERVICE FUND BUDGET

On April 28, 2015, the City of Stockton (City) Fire Department experienced a total loss to Fire Engine No. 5105 (Company 12) when the fire engine was involved in a major motor vehicle accident; and

Unit No. 5105 is a 2006 Pierce Quantum Model E-2, one of twelve front-line and five reserve fire engines used by the City's twelve fire stations; and

One of the five reserve units was placed into front-line service to replace damaged Unit No. 5105; and

The City now has only four reserve units, three of which are over twenty years old; and

Routine repairs and preventative maintenance work often take several units out of service at the same time, leaving the City with minimal reserve coverage making the replacement of Unit No. 5105 a priority; and

Stockton Municipal Code (SMC) section 3.68.070 provides for an exception to the competitive bidding requirements for contracts in cases where the City Council has approved findings that support and justify the application of the SMC section; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Pursuant to SMC section 3.68.070, the City Council approves the following findings which support an exception to the competitive bidding process in the award of a contract for the purchase of one fire engine from Rosenbauer America:

a. Rosenbauer Fire Apparatus has been selected by City staff as the preferred manufacturer of heavy fire equipment. The purchase of this brand of truck provides for standardization of parts and equipment, and minimizes training requirements.

b. Maintenance and repair costs for this class of truck will be lower as a result of this standardization.

c. The price of this truck from Rosenbauer America is reasonable and this vendor is the only dealer of this specific brand and model of truck.

2. Based on these findings and pursuant to SMC section 3.68.070, the City Council declares that an exception to the competitive bidding process is justified and approves the replacement purchase of one fire engine from Rosenbauer America, at a total cost of \$503,018.07. A copy of the purchase agreement is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.

3. The City Council authorizes a budget amendment to the Fiscal Year 2015-16 General Insurance Internal Service Fund Annual Budget for the associated reimbursement revenues and expenditures.

4. The City Manager or his designee is authorized and directed to execute all documents, including but not limited to agreements and amendments and to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
