The Community Corrections Partnership of San Joaquin County formed a Task force in 2012 to support the premise of prison realignment; and

The Task Force uses Problem Oriented Policing (POP) model focusing on offenders who are wanted for a new crime or compliance violation, have a history of violence, are repeat offenders or are at high risk of becoming repeat offenders; and

The Task Force services each of the cities within San Joaquin County based on identified need; and

Since 2012, funding allocated through AB 109 to San Joaquin County has been applied for and awarded to support the core team members of the Task Force; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Independent Contractor Agreement between San Joaquin County and City of Stockton, for AB109 funding of the Community Corrections Partnership Task Force is hereby approved.
- 2. The City Manager, as Fiscal Agent for the cities of San Joaquin County, is authorized to accept \$768,629 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-18 Police Grant Funds.
