RESOLUTION OVERRULING PROTESTS, CONFIRMING ASSESSMENT OF DELINQUENT CODE ENFORCEMENT CHARGES, AND DIRECTING THE ASSESSMENTS BE PLACED ON THE SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY TAX ROLL

Chapter 1.24 of the Stockton Municipal Code (SMC) provides for the assessment of unpaid costs, fees, fines, and /or penalties that have become delinquent due to code enforcement activities, and that these assessments be placed on the secured property tax roll for each of the affected properties; and

A hearing was held on May 24, 2017, at 1:30 p.m., in the City Council Chambers at City Hall, wherein all objections to property tax assessments for code enforcement charges were overruled by the Administrative Hearing Officer; and

All rights of appeal afforded by the SMC have expired or have been exercised; and

The "Delinquent Accounts 2017 Assessment List," attached as Exhibit 1, represents assessments against the property owners, trustees, or administrators of the noted properties for reimbursement of code enforcement charges including costs, fees, fines, and/or penalties that have become delinquent; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. All protests and/or objections to the charges listed in the "Delinquent Accounts 2017 Assessment List," attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and by reference made a part hereof, are hereby overruled.

2. The "Delinquent Accounts 2017 Assessment List" is hereby confirmed.

3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the Director of Administrative Services of the City of Stockton, who is hereby authorized to and shall cause the amount of the assessments to be added to the next regular bill of taxes levied against said properties for municipal purposes, which said amounts shall be collected at the time and in the same manner as ordinary municipal taxes are collected, and shall be subject to the same penalties and procedures under foreclosure and sale in case of delinquency as provided for ordinary municipal taxes.

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4. The City Manager is authorized to take such other actions as are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
