RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AND SUBMIT THE CYCLE ONE MEASURE K NON-COMPETITIVE BICYCLE, PEDESTRIAN, AND SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM FUNDS CLAIM IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,092,577 AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AND SUBMIT ALL FUTURE CLAIMS

The Measure K Non-Competitive Bicycle, Pedestrian, and Safe Routes to School Program (BP-SRtS) is intended to fund bicycle, pedestrian, and Safe Routes to School projects. These funds are available based on a formula share outlined in the Measure K Renewal Program; and

The program funds can be used for stand-alone projects that are important to the community or to help provide matching funds for competitive grant opportunities; and

The Measure K Non-Competitive BP-SRtS funds are eligible to be claimed by the City in the amount of \$1,092,577; and

Funding claimed as part of Cycle One will be appropriated during the annual Capital Improvement Plan budget process to the Miner Avenue Complete Streets Median Improvements Phase 3, Project No. PW1732; and

The San Joaquin Council of Governments requires the claim documents include a Council resolution authorizing a specific staff member to submit the claim for reimbursement; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute and submit a claim in the amount of \$1,092,577 to the San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) for Cycle One (2017-2021) Measure K Non-Competitive BP-SRtS Program funds to be used for the Miner Avenue Complete Streets Median Improvements Phase 3, Project No. PW1732, a copy of the claim is attached as Exhibit 1 and is incorporated by this reference.
- 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to execute and submit all future claims to SJCOG as they relate to Measure K Non-Competitive BP-SRtS Program funds.

 The City Manager is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
