## STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO PRELIMINARILY APPROVE THE FISCAL YEAR 2018-19 CENTRAL STOCKTON LIGHTING MAINTENANCE DISTRICT ANNUAL ENGINEER'S REPORT, PRELIMINARILY APPROVE THE PROPOSED FISCAL YEAR 2018-19 BUDGET, AND SET A PUBLIC HEARING FOR JUNE 5, 2018

On July 26, 2011, the City Council of the City of Stockton adopted Resolution No. 11-0209, which formed the Central Stockton Lighting Maintenance District (Zone 4, Oxford Manor), pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972; and

The Engineer of Work made and filed with the City Clerk, the Annual Engineer's Report (the "Engineer's Report") for the district for Fiscal Year (FY) 2018-2019 containing a full and detailed description of the improvements, the boundaries of the assessment district, the proposed budget for FY 2018-19, and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the assessment district necessary to fund maintenance of specialty streetlights in the Oxford Manor area; and

The City Council has duly considered said Engineer's Report and the assessments proposed for the maintenance of the improvements, and finds that the Engineer's Report is sufficient and that neither said Engineer's Report, nor any part thereof, requires modification in any respect; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City Council finds that the Engineer's Report generally describes the existing and proposed improvements and any substantial changes proposed to be made to existing improvements and indicates the general location of the district and a full and detailed description of the improvements, the boundaries of the assessment district and the zones therein, and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the district. The Engineer's Report is on file with and can be viewed at the office of the City Clerk.
- 2. The Engineer's Report for the maintenance of the improvements for FY 2018-19 is preliminarily approved and confirmed for the Central Stockton Lighting Maintenance District. All of the assessments are within the assessment formula or range of assessments previously approved for the assessment district at the time it was established.
- 3. The City Council intends to levy and collect the assessments set forth in the Engineer's Report.

- 4. Tuesday, June 5, 2018, at 5:30 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 425 North El Dorado Street, Stockton, California, is set as the date, time, and place when the City Council will conduct a public hearing to consider the final approval of the Annual Engineer's Report and the levy and collection of assessments for FY 2018-19.
- 5. The City Clerk is authorized and directed to publish notice of this public hearing in a newspaper of local circulation, at least ten (10) days prior to said hearing date, by publishing this resolution as required by the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 (Cal Sts & Hy Code, §§ 22552 and 22553).
- 6. The City Manager is authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
