RESOLUTION APPROVING EIGHT MEASURE K RENEWAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS WITH THE SAN JOAQUIN COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS FOR THE BICYCLE, PEDESTRIAN, AND SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL AND SMART GROWTH INCENTIVE PROGRAMS

On December 15, 2017, the City submitted 12 project applications for funding. On January 29, 2018, the San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) informed the City that eight of the 12 applications submitted by the City were recommended for funding as follows:

For each project receiving funding, the City must enter into a separate Measure K Renewal Cooperative Agreement with SJCOG. The funding provided under these agreements will be appropriated during the annual Capital Improvement Program budget; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City Council authorizes the City Manager to execute eight Measure K Renewal Cooperative Agreements from the Measure K Bicycle, Pedestrian, and Safe Routes to School and Smart Growth Incentive Programs for a total of \$11,448,240, copies of which are attached as Exhibits 1-8 and incorporated by this reference.
- 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
