## STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF STOCKTON TO ACCEPT GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$241,934 FROM THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL, TOBACCO LAW ENFORCEMENT GRANT PROGRAM, AND AUTHORIZING THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES, AND AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2018-19 ANNUAL BUDGET

The City of Stockton (City) is interested in participating in the Tobacco Law Enforcement Grant Program, which is made available through The California Healthcare, Research and Prevention Tobacco Tax Act of 2016 (Prop. 56) and administered by the California Department of Justice (DOJ) to support local efforts to reduce the illegal sale of tobacco products to minors in the City; and

Following the City's submittal of a proposal for the Program, the State of California DOJ offered to award \$241,934 for the two-year grant program beginning July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2020; and

Grant funds will be used for Stockton Police Department Officer overtime costs related to tobacco enforcement operations, roll call training, and local retailer inspection operations, operating costs, equipment, travel expenses for DOJ-sponsored training, and a \$197,710 Professional Services Agreement with San Joaquin County Public Health Services (SJCPHS); and

In order to be considered eligible to receive grant funding, the City must submit a completed Grant Award Memorandum of Understanding to the State of California DOJ; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City Manager or a designated representative is hereby authorized, on behalf of the City, to accept grant funding in the amount of \$241,934 from the State of California DOJ.
- 2. The City Manager or a designated representative is hereby authorized, on behalf of the City, to execute a two-year Professional Services Agreement between the City and SJCPHS, not to exceed \$197,710.
- 3. The City Manager or a designated representative is hereby authorized and directed, on behalf of the City, to execute the grant documents and to submit all

documents, including, without limitation, contracts, amendments, extensions, and payment requests as appropriate to accept the funds under and comply with the conditions of the grant.

- 4. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to establish all required accounts and make any and all expenditures, appropriations, transfers, and/or distributions of funds on behalf of the City as are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this resolution.
- 5. Grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant ongoing law enforcement expenditures.
