March 5th Council Approved Expansion of Cannabis Regulatory Program

Council Approved on March 5, 2019

- Expansion of business types to include distribution, manufacturing, testing, retail non-storefront (delivery), and microbusiness, in addition to new cultivation and retail storefronts (dispensaries).
- Controlled roll-out via a phased approach limiting new cultivation, volatile manufacturing, retail storefront (dispensaries), and microbusiness cannabis business types to two per year
- Equity Program through a lottery system establishing
 1) a general pool of applicants and 2) an equity pool of applicants for annually limited business types.

Council Approved on March 5, 2019

- Approved by-right allowances to existing businesses.
 - Cultivators: Distribution, Non-Volatile Manufacturing, and Non-storefront (delivery only)
 - Retail Storefront: Non-storefront (delivery only)
- Updated the Cannabis Operators Permit Fee

Additional Items Presented to Council on July 16, 2019

- 1. Additional by-right allowances for existing permitted operators
- 2. Analysis of location requirements and how they compare to State regulations
- 3. The reduction of tax rates for Testing Laboratories
- 4. Streamlining of City and State approval processes
- 5. Workforce diversity component to the Equity Program



Workforce Diversity Requirement

- Incentive Voluntary Program
- Business License Application (new or renewal)
- 50% Workforce Diversity requirement
- Employees must reside in SB 535 disadvantaged area
- Incentive: 50% reduction of Business License tax.

Additional Ordinance Updates

- Parking requirement for Cultivation
- Eliminate Security and Lighting Plan Redundancy
- Require Retail Non-Storefront (delivery) delivery drivers to possess a valid CA driver's license
- Microbusiness definition added to Title 5
- Clarification regarding Testing Laboratories unable to obtain vertical integration
- Clarification in Title 16 indicating that the Administrative Guidelines referenced in Section 5.100.300 of the Code also apply to Section 16.80.195
