

# STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

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## **RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE UNREPRESENTED POLICE SAFETY UNIT AND THE CITY OF STOCKTON TO SHARE THE COST OF THE EMPLOYER'S RETIREMENT CONTRIBUTION TO CALPERS PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 20516**

On October 29, 2019, the City Council of the City of Stockton, by motion, authorized the City Manager to execute the Unrepresented Management/Confidential and Law Employees' Compensation Plan between the City of Stockton and the Unrepresented Management/Confidential and Law employees, which includes provisions for the Unrepresented Police Safety Unit to share the cost of what is defined as employer contributions, on a pre-tax basis, pursuant to the provisions of Public Employees' Retirement Law (Gov. Code § 20516); and

Unrepresented Police Safety Unit consisting of the Chief of Police and the Deputy Chiefs of Police agree that effective on such date as the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) approves a contract amendment implementing a cost sharing agreement pursuant to Government Code Section 20516 ("Gov.Code § 20516"); and

Unrepresented Police Safety Unit shall pay three percent (3%) of their compensation towards the City of Stockton employer contribution rate pursuant to Section 20516; and

The foregoing three percent (3%) shall be over and above the normal contribution rate required by the Public Employees' Retirement Law (PERL); and

The following is a statement of the proposed change:

Effective July 1, 2016, unrepresented police personnel (regardless of status under the Public Employees' Pension Reform Act ((PEPRA)) shall pay an additional 3% toward the employer contribution of PERS; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council does hereby approve the Agreement between Unrepresented Police Safety Unit (Attachment A), stating that the City of Stockton has complied with the provisions of retirement law by agreeing in writing with its Unrepresented Police Safety Unit to share the cost of 3% above the Employer's Normal Contribution rate.

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2. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
