

Whether working at a daily newspaper or in private and public libraries, my interests have inevitably turned to history – of the organization for which I worked, its creation, and the setting (city) in which it has flourished. At the same time my curiosity involves home architecture and preservation of unique and beloved city structures. In my early newspaper career, I produced local "building" pages featuring outstanding or historic homes and/or architecture. At Chavez Branch, Stockton-San Joaquin County Library System, I was for years the adult programming director and the majority of the programs starred Stockton and San Joaquin County history. Many programs were unusual, including a rare display of the library's valuable Audubon prints, presented in collaboration with the Haggin Museum. I am now a local historian.
