AWARD A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT TO SUPERIOR TANK SOLUTIONS, INC. FOR COATING AND REPAIR OF THE 14 MILE RESERVOIR SITE TANKS AND AMEND THE FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 ANNUAL BUDGET

The Municipal Utilities Department (MUD) provides drinking water service to Stockton residents through an extensive water production and distribution system; and

Water storage tanks are an important part the of the City's water distribution system; and

Water storage tanks located throughout the City store water to meet fire flows and peak demands. Maintenance and rehabilitation ensure adequate drinking water supply and pressure for the City's customers; and

The 14 Mile Reservoir Site is located to the west of Interstate 5 between March Lane and Ben Holt Drive. Work to be completed at the site includes interior and exterior coating of both water storage tanks, and structural upgrades to both tanks needed to comply with updated United States Department of Labor Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standards; and

The rehabilitation and repairs of the water storage tanks require the contractor to meet American Water Works Association (AWWA) and NSF 61 standards which will allow necessary tank repairs and improvements to be completed in accordance with all compliance standards; and

The Municipal Utilities Department staff recommends an award of a professional service agreement to Superior Tank Solutions, Inc. in the Not-to-Exceed amount of \$1,854,065; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council approves the following findings pursuant to Stockton Municipal Code section 3.68.070 in support of an exception to the competitive bidding process:

a. Use of the RFP process is appropriate for this Professional Services Contract because it relies on the evaluation of professional qualifications and performance as the basis for selection of a vendor. Use of these criteria helps ensure selection of a vendor that will provide the highest quality professional service, which is in the public interest.

- b. It is imperative that structural repairs on the water storage tanks meet AWWA Section D.100 standards.
- c. Coatings/paints used for water storage tanks must meet NSF 61 requirements in accordance with AWWA Section D. 102-11.
- d. It is in the public interest to have a qualified vendor who possess the required "A" General Engineering License, an ISO 9001 certification and C-33 License.

2. The Professional Services Agreement for water storage tank coating and repair at the 14 Mile Reservoir Site, in the Not-To-Exceed amount of \$1,854,065, between the City of Stockton and Superior Tank Solutions, Inc. is hereby awarded, and the City Manager is authorized and directed to execute the same, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.

3. The City Council approves an amendment to the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Annual Budget and the appropriation of \$354,065 from the Water Utility Fund Balance account to the Water Well Production Capital Outlay account.

4. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
