- **OFFICE OF VIOLENCE PREVENTION**
- Ceasefire, the Office of Violence Prevention's (OVP) strategy, mitigates gang and gun violence through targeted outreach, community engagement, and law enforcement collaboration. The OVP works to interrupt violence cycles via direct communication with high-risk individuals, providing support for alternative paths and addressing root causes to foster a safer and more resilient Stockton community.
- OVP provides intensive case management to empower high-risk individuals to become self-sufficient and reduce violent activities.
- OVP Total Average Caseload: 76
 - Average Caseload - Youth: 24%
 - Average Caseload - Adults: 76%
