

This stucco clad building is located on the southeastern corner of N. Grant and E. Rose Streets. The structure is a two-story building with a steep gable roof covered with tile. The north side of the roof has a hipped dormer with two attic vents. Large multi-paned windows create a symmetrical fenestration. The first floor windows have awnings. The main entrance is at the southern side of the building. The entrance is recessed into the building with large concrete blocks surrounding the opening. Above the entrance is a large multi-paned awning window with geometric plaster work. The building is irregular in plan with 6,192 square feet and appears to be in good condition.

The district has retained its ability to convey its significance through the resources present.


