WHEREAS, RECIPIENTS agreed to extend the Firearms Reduction Consortium program during the additional federal fiscal years of 2017, 2018, 2019, in accordance with the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program award; and

WHEREAS, RECIPIENTS agreed to extend the Firearms Reduction Consortium program during the additional federal fiscal years of 2020, 2021, and 2022, in accordance with the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program award; and

WHEREAS, RECIPIENTS agreed to extend the Firearms Reduction Consortium program during the additional federal fiscal years of 2023, 2024, and 2025, in accordance with the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program award; and

WHEREAS, for federal fiscal year 2024, STOCKTON will distribute the proceeds of the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program award for the Recipient programs as identified in Attachment A;

NOW THEREFORE, RECIPIENTS agree as follows:

- 1. The allocation of Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funds for federal fiscal year 2024 shall be distributed as set forth in Attachment A.
- 2. All other provisions of the MOU remain the same.
