# **Program Calls Over Time**



# Program Calls December 2024 – May 2025

- During this period:
  - 1,107 initial calls
  - 2,254 follow up calls
- Of known reason for call:
  - **70%** welfare/wellness check
  - **10%** emotional disturbance (family or general)
  - **9%** community concern
  - **8%** mild to moderate BH intervention
  - 2% suicidal/homicidal ideations
  - 1% unknown



### Race/Ethnicity & Age Dec '24 – May '25

- Caller's average age was 39 years old
- 37% of initial calls came from patients under 30
- 129 calls for age 18 or under
- 11.5 % of the population in Stockton is Black/African American (37,000 + people)
- 15 % of calls were for Black/ African American
- 8 calls out of 107 from PD were Black/African American



# Gender Dec '24 – May '25

 Available for 1,087 of 1,107 initial calls the past 6 months

There are 14 initial calls where Gender was listed as something besides Male or Female.

- 2 gender nonconforming

- 2 other gender not listed

- 6 trans female
- 3 trans male

### Treatment:

# USE OF OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDS Care Solace

### **Connecting People Who Need Help to the Help They Need**

- Support centralized call centers that provide information and connections to appropriate services and supports for persons with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) and any cooccurring Substance Use Disorder/Mental Health (SUD/MH) conditions.
- ✓ Purchase automated versions of Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) services, and support ongoing costs of the technology.
- ✓ Expand warm hand-off services to transition to recovery.
