#### **BACKGROUND**


# Property Business Improvement District (PBID):


- Established in 1997, with an initial five-year term
- Renewed by Council in 2002, 2007, and 2017, for five-year terms
- Current DSPBID set to expire December 31, 2026

# Community Improvement District (CID):

- Allowed under City Code in 2022
- Allows longer term- 20 years





# **Funding**

**Budget:** 

\$1,862,000 Million

DSCID MDP would provide funding in three "bundles" or categories:

Clean, Safe, Beautiful – 77%

Business Development- 10%

Advocacy, Administration, Reserve – 13%

#### **Proposed District duration:**

20 years beginning January 1, 2027

### **Timeline and Process**

• March 1, 2025: Began petition distribution

• **July 2, 2025**: Signed petitions delivered to the City:

31.89% without City signed petitions

51.89% with City signed petitions

July 29, 2025: Resolution of Intention

• **September 23, 2025**: Public Hearing closes and ballots counted- Final District

approval if ballots support.

# RECOMMENDATION

## Adopt a Resolution with the following:

- Expressing City intent to form the Downtown Stockton Community Improvement District;
- Accepting petitions of property owners;
- Preliminarily approving the Management District Plan and Engineer's Report;
- Approving the proposed boundary map;
- Set Public Hearing and the levy of assessments for September 23, 2025;
- Providing for property owner ballots and notices of the public hearing to be mailed; and
- Authorizing and directing the City Manager, or designee, to sign petitions and ballots for City-owned properties in favor of formation.
