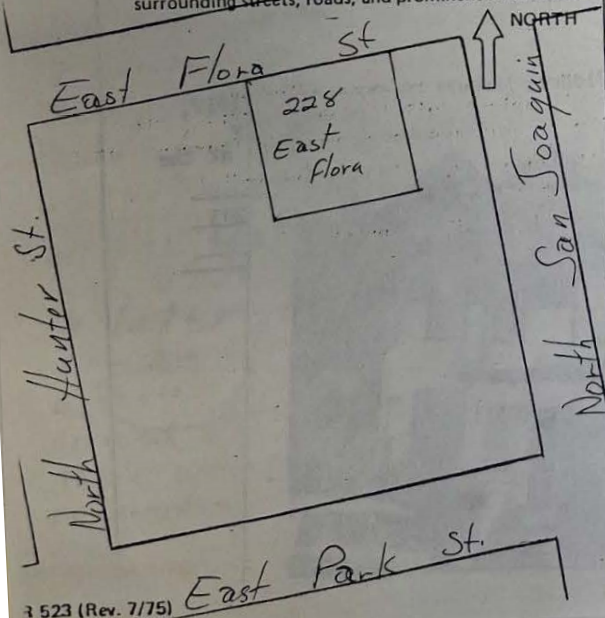

DESCRIPTION

- Briefly describe the present physical appearance of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

This two story building has some Queen Anne features. It has a gablet style roof. There are louvered vents in the attic. The siding on most of the house is wooden but there are fishscale shingles one-half the way down. There is a square bay on the east and west sides of the structure with slim double hung windows, and an angled bay with large double hung windows facing the front. There is an open porch with a hipped roof. The porch has two grouped pillars of three for support. There are wooden stairs with stepped brick rails ending up to the entrance. The room on the east side of the building appears to have been added at a later date. It has three multipaned windows and a single paned double sash window. There are trees and shrubbery surrounding this structure. There was an east side addition in 1935.

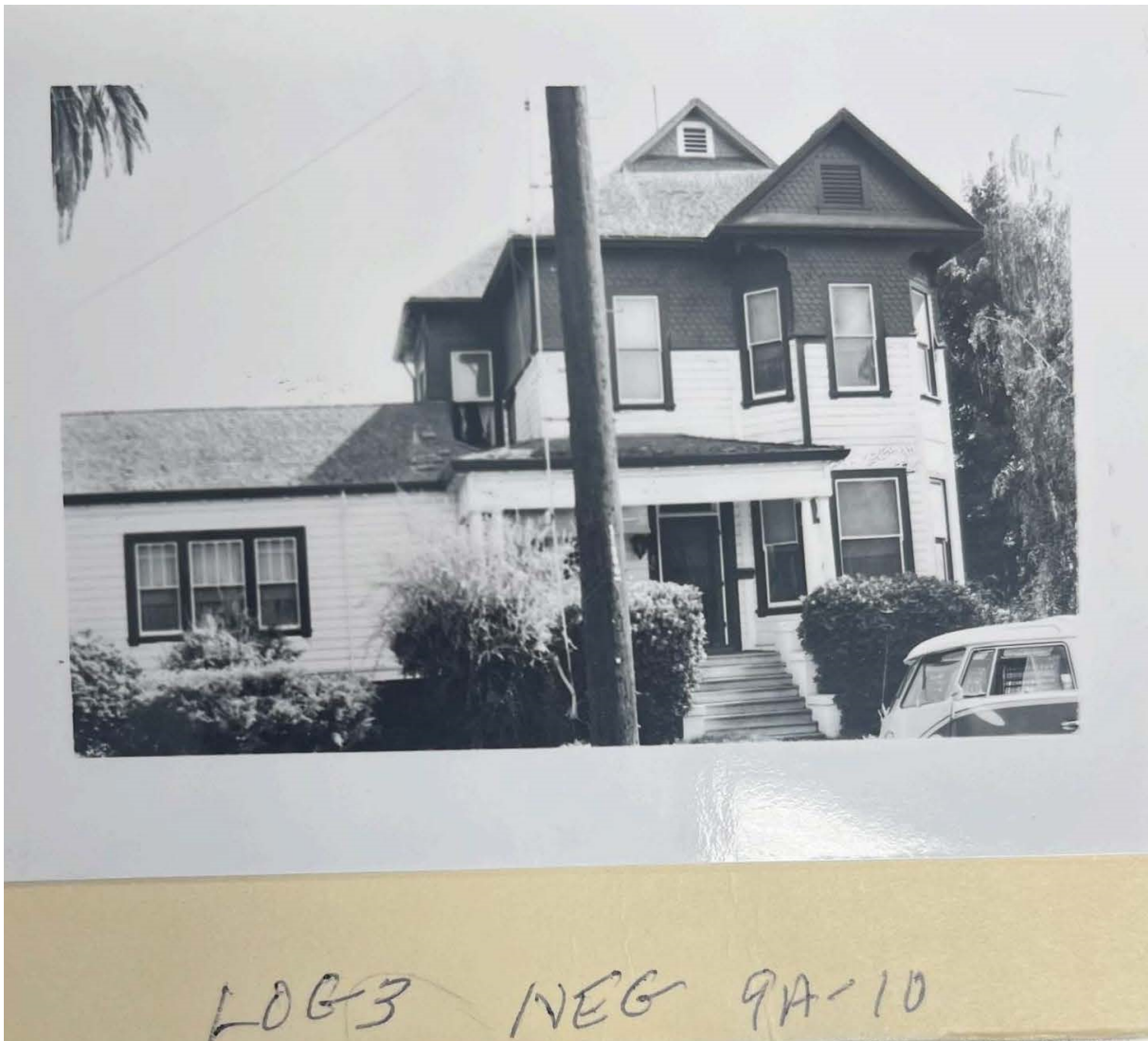
