# STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

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## **RESOLUTION TRANSFERRING FUNDS AND AWARDING A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT FOR THE BRIDGE REHABILITATION AND REPLACEMENT PROGRAM PHASE V, PROJECT NO. WT19011/FEDERAL PROJECT NO. BPMPL-5008(220)**

On July 1, 2025, the City advertised a Request for Proposals (RFP) for preliminary engineering services for the Bridge Rehabilitation and Replacement Program Phase V, Project No. WT19011/Federal Project No. BPMPL-5008(220). One proposal was received; and

On August 28, 2025, the City re-advertised an RFP for preliminary engineering services for the Bridge Rehabilitation and Replacement Program Phase V, Project No. WT19011/Federal Project No. BPMPL-5008(220). One proposal was received; and

A Selection Committee comprised of Public Works' staff evaluated the proposal submitted by MGE Engineering, Inc. MGE Engineering, Inc. was determined to be qualified for this project. Staff negotiated a fee in the amount of \$366,506.54 with MGE Engineering, Inc. for preliminary engineering services; and

Transfer of funds is needed to fund all remaining costs to complete the preliminary engineering services; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The City Council approves the transfer of funds in the amount of \$289,160 from the Bridge Maintenance Program, Project No. WT23010, to the Bridge Rehabilitation and Replacement Program Phase V, Project No. WT19011/Federal Project No. BPMPL-5008(220).

2. The City Council approves findings pursuant to Stockton Municipal Code (SMC) section 3.68.070 in support of an exception to the competitive bidding process. These findings include:

- a. The City does not have staffing available to provide the design of this project within the required deadlines.
- b. The scope of the design services requires an engineering firm experienced in bridge rehabilitation design.

- c. Use of the RFP process is appropriate for this Professional Services Contract because it relies on the evaluation of professional qualifications and performance as the basis for selection of a vendor. Use of the criteria helps ensure selection of a vendor that will provide the highest quality professional service, which is in the public interest.
- d. The City negotiated a contract following solicitation of competitive proposals in accordance with SMC section 3.68.070.A.3.

3. The City Council awards a Professional Services Contract between the City of Stockton and MGE Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$366,506.54, and the City Manager is authorized and directed to execute same, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.

4. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
