

Background

- During the pandemic, Nonprofits and other community-based organizations were called upon by the City to serve those most in need, while oftentimes facing significant reductions in revenue streams.
- Through funding provided by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), Council authorized the development of a Community Support Grant Program (Motion 2022-11-15-1205).
- The City issued a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) offering a one-time grant to eligible organizations providing programs, services, or activities that respond to and mitigate the various COVID-19 related community impacts.
- \$2.6 million in total was awarded to 34 nonprofits in November 2022.
- Contracts were executed as organizations were able to provide the required information.



The EFB is grateful for the sustained support of our Programs.

Through the Community Support Grant Nutrition Educators and staff:

- Our Fresh Produce Program distribution increased by 520,623 pounds over the previous year, reaching a total distribution of 1,646,382 pounds of fresh produce.
- 12 sites were added to our Mobile Farmer's Market Program, bringing fresh produce distribution, nutrition education and coaching, live cooking demonstrations, and in-person contact to 84 sites and 29,226 recipients over the last year.
- In-person Nutrition Education and independent living demonstrations and instruction, by our degreed Nutrition Educators, are administered directly in the dining room at St. Mary's Community Services.
- We work with several partners weekly to distribute nutrition-dense foods in Homeless Encampments. Our partners include *SJ County Public Health, Gospel Center Rescue Mission, St. Mary's Community Services, Community Medical Centers, and the Salvation Army.*
