## RESOLUTION TO APPROVE AND ADOPT THE MOVE DOWNTOWN FINAL REPORT ADDRESSING DOWNTOWN STOCKTON MULTIMODAL TRANSPORTATION NETWORK AND LAND USE COMPATIBILITY

The San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) served as the primary recipient, and the City of Stockton served as a sub-recipient for funding awarded through the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) Sustainable Transportation Planning Grant Program; and

The City of Stockton executed a contract with Mark Thomas & Company to develop the Move Downtown Final Report (MDFR) and analyze multimodal connections between key transit assets, including the existing Downtown Transit Center, Robert J. Cabral ACE Station, and the San Joaquin Street Amtrak Station; and

The primary objective of the project was to develop a comprehensive MDFR to improve multimodal connectivity between the transit stations to advance Transit Oriented Development (TOD); and

The resulting Move Downtown Final Report establishes a long-term framework to guide transportation and land use investments that support a safer, more connected, equitable, and economically vibrant downtown; and

The MDFR includes infrastructure and programmatic recommendations that support joint development opportunities, transit-oriented development, and improved multimodal access throughout the Downtown area; and

The MDFR also includes an implementation roadmap identifying phased actions, cost considerations, funding opportunities, and performance measures to support future capital improvement planning, grant applications, and coordinated decision-making; and

Public and stakeholder feedback helped shape the Move Downtown Final Report, which emphasizes complete streets, transit-oriented development, joint development opportunities, and improved multimodal connectivity; and

The MDFR aligns with and supports existing City initiatives, including the Capital Improvement Program and Envision Stockton 2040 General Plan; and
