RESOLUTION TO ALLOCATE FUNDING FROM THE HOMELESS HOUSING, ASSISTANCE AND PREVENTION (HHAP) PROGRAM TO ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATIONS FOR EXISTING REPAID REHOUSING, RENTAL ASSISTANCE, AND/OR LANDLORD INCENTIVE PROGRAMS AND CHILD CARE VOUCHERS THAT PREVENT HOMELESSNESS

The City applied for and received an award of Homeless Housing Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) funds from the State of California (State); and

The State's HHAP funds are designed to support regionally coordinated efforts between the County, Continuum of Care (CoC) and the City to expand and develop local capacity to address immediate homelessness challenges throughout the state. HHAP funds are focused on moving homeless individuals and families into permanent housing and ensuring those individuals and families maintain their permanent housing. However, funds for all the City's HHAP awards are limited to those that are operating and serving Stockton residence; and

Staff recommends that Council approve a resolution authorizing the allocation of HHAP funding to the following projects:

- Amelia Ann Adams Whole Life Center - Housing Justice Program
Services include: Case Management to determine needs and necessary services such as: Eviction Prevention, Rapid Rehousing, Landlord Incentives, and Security Deposits; and
- Family Resource Center –
Housing Assistance Program, Services include: Case Management to determine needs and necessary services such as: Eviction Prevention and Security Deposits; and

Childcare Vouchers, Serving the most vulnerable population on the waitlist children under 2 years of age, assisting with providing childcare vouchers for parents, who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Approve and allocate HHAP recommendations for funding totaling \$1,000,000 for the following projects:

- An award in the amount of \$482,730.00 for Amelia Ann Adams Whole Life Center (AAAWLC) – Housing Justice Program
- An award in the amount of \$571,270.00 for Family Resource Center (FRC) – Housing Assistance Program

2. Approve and allocate an award of HHAP funds in the amount of \$700,000 for the Childcare Voucher Program to Family Resource Center.

3. Approve findings pursuant to Stockton Municipal Code Section 3.68.070 that support an exception to the competitive bidding process.

4. Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to defund and reallocate awarded funding if the project is unable to meet the required spending obligations, or the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) does not approve the use of funds as detailed in this Resolution. If defunded, the funding is to be reallocated to eligible projects that can meet HCD timelines and general requirements.

5. The City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
