

STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

ADOPT A RESOLUTION TO ALLOCATE GRANT FUNDING FROM THE HOMELESS HOUSING, ASSISTANCE AND PREVENTION (HHAP) PROGRAM TO PERMANENT AND INTERIM HOUSING PROJECTS AND APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND APPROPRIATE GRANT FUNDING FROM HHAP ROUND 6

The State's Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention Program (HHAP) funds are designed to support regionally coordinated efforts between the County, Continuum of Care (CoC), and the City to expand and develop local capacity to address immediate homelessness challenges throughout the state. HHAP funds are focused on moving homeless individuals and families into permanent housing and ensuring those individuals and families maintain their permanent housing; and

HHAP grants are formula-based; however, the City is still required to apply for funds. Approval of this recommendation will position the City to apply for funds just made available in March through the NOFA application. In February, staff received notification that the possible award amount for HHAP 6 could be \$11,531,786.79. The application is due in August and must be applied for in conjunction with San Joaquin County; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Approve and allocate the following HHAP Rounds 3 and 4 recommendations for funding in the total of \$3.4 million, which includes the following 5 projects:

- \$409,010 to Children's Home of Stockton for the Catalyst Project.
- \$409,010 to Lutheran Social Services of Stockton for Project Hope.
- \$409,010 to PREVAIL of Stockton for the Propel Project.
- \$1,244,210 to St. Mary's Community Services of Stockton for Pathways Neighborhood.
- \$1,415,440 to Delta Community Developers Corp. for Harding Way Apartments.

2. Authorize staff to apply for, accept, and appropriate grant funding for Round 6 of the Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention Grant Program.
