RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE ALLOCATION OF ROUND I GRANT FUNDING FROM THE HOMELESS HOUSING, ASSISTANCE AND PREVENTION (HHAP) PROGRAM TO INTERIM HOUSING

The City received an allocation of funds from the California Interagency Council on Homelessness (formerly State of California Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council), Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency (BCSH). Management of said funding has since been transitioned to the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD); and

On August 20, 2019, the City Council approved Resolution Number 2019-08-20-1404 authorizing the submission of a grant application in response to the Assembly Bill 101 (AB 101) announcement of available funding through the State's Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention Program. Staff applied for Homeless Housing funds in February 2020, and was allocated \$6,460,265.40 on April 16, 2020 (HHAP Round 1 Funds); and

City Council obligated HHAP Round 1 Funds to twelve (12) projects and multiple entities on November 17, 2020, through the approval of Resolution 2020-11-17-14-02 (HHAP Round I Award Resolution), including the organization Sacramento Self-Help. After entering into a contract with Sacramento Self-Help, the organization ceased operations and subsequently filed for bankruptcy. There are remaining funds from the contract in the amount of \$18,148.61 which are eligible to be reallocated to one of the other entities who was awarded funding through the HHAP Round I Resolution; and

Children's Home of Stockton was awarded funding under the HHAP Round I Resolution. Children's Home of Stockton provides shelter and supportive services for Transitional Age Youth (TAY), ages 18-25 experiencing, or at risk of homelessness in Stockton through the Catalyst Program. Children's Home of Stockton has a track record of successful projects, ability to meet grant funding reporting obligations, and meets the Council's goals of supporting the City's youth; and

HHAP funds are designed to support regionally coordinated efforts between the County, Continuum of Care (CoC), and the City to expand and develop local capacity to address immediate homelessness challenges throughout the state. HHAP funds are focused on moving homeless individuals and families into permanent housing and ensuring those individuals and families maintain their permanent housing; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. Approve and allocate HHAP funding as follows:

- \$18,148.61 to Children's Home of Stockton for the Catalyst Project

2. Authorize the City Manager, or designee, to enter into and execute any associated documents and take whatever actions are appropriate and necessary to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
