WHEREAS, Lindsay Point in the City of Stockton, the site of the present City Hall, was the location of the first dwelling erected by an American within the present city limits of the City of Stockton, and

WHEREAS, said Lindsay Point has been designated by the State Legislature as a point of historical interest, thereby establishing the site as a location for a historical plaque, and

WHEREAS, the San Joaquin County Historical Society has requested permission to install a commemorative plaque on said Lindsay Point, on or about the present City Hall to designate and mark this site as prominent in our City's history; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON,
AS FOLLOWS:

That this City Council does hereby grant permission to the San Joaquin County Historical Society to install a commemorative plaque on Lindsay Point, the site of the present City Hall to designate and mark the site of the first dwelling erected by Americans within the City Limits of the City of Stockton, provided however, that said permission is granted upon the condition that said plaque shall be embedded in a bannister on the north steps of City Hall.
