RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CONTRACT WITH EVOQUA WATER TECHNOLOGIES WITH A NOT-TO-EXCEED COST OF \$1,297,100 FOR THE PURCHASE OF HYDROGEN PEROXIDE FOR WASTEWATER TREATMENT

The Municipal Utilities Department (MUD) staff operate and maintain the Regional Wastewater Control Facility (RWCF), an advanced tertiary wastewater treatment facility with a 55 million-gallon per day (MGD) capacity located adjacent to the San Joaquin River; and

The RWCF currently uses ferric chloride in combination with hydrogen peroxide to reduce hydrogen sulfide concentrations in the wastewater treatment process. Hydrogen sulfide is a corrosive compound that can lead to premature infrastructure failure and costly repairs if not managed; and

On January 29, 2026, an Invitation to Bid for the purchase of hydrogen peroxide for wastewater treatment (PUR 26-020) was publicly advertised in the Legal Notice Section of The Record and on the City's Bid Flash webpage. Additionally, the bid specifications were sent to prospective bidders through AskStockton; and

On March 12, 2026, the City Clerk's office received two sealed bids. Evoqua Water Technologies LLC of Sarasota, Florida, submitted the low bid that was regular in all aspects with a cost of \$2.49 per gallon. Staff estimate an annual maximum purchase of 90,000 gallons of hydrogen peroxide for wastewater treatment; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Specifications and Addenda for the Invitation for Bids for the Purchase of Hydrogen Peroxide for Wastewater Treatment (PUR 26-020) are hereby accepted and attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.

2. A five-year contract with Evoqua Water Technologies, LLC of Sarasota, Florida, to provide hydrogen peroxide for wastewater treatment at the Regional Wastewater Control Facility for a total not-to-exceed cost of \$1,297,100, is hereby approved, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 2 and incorporated by this reference.

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3. The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized to take necessary and appropriate actions to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
