# STOCKTON CITY COUNCIL

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## **RESOLUTION TO FORM THE FIVE MILE SLOUGH ASSESSMENT DISTRICT, APPROVE THE ENGINEER'S REPORT, AND AUTHORIZE THE LEVY OF A PROPOSED ASSESSMENT**

The Engineer of Work has made and filed with the City Clerk the Engineer's Report (the "Engineer's Report"), attached as Exhibit 1, for the proposed Five Mile Slough Assessment District containing a full and detailed description of the improvements, the boundaries of the assessment district, the proposed budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2027-28, and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the assessment district necessary to fund maintenance of the special benefits outlined in the Engineer's Report; and

The City has caused notice of the proposed assessment to be mailed to all landowners within the proposed district at least 45 days prior to the hearing on the formation of the Assessment District and the levy of the assessment, consistent with the requirements of Proposition 218; and

On June 23, 2026, the City conducted a duly noticed hearing on the formation of the Assessment District and the levying of the proposed assessment; and

The City Council has reviewed the protests received, and the City Clerk and Engineer have tallied those protests. No majority protest to the formation of the Assessment District or levy of the proposed assessment has been received; and

The City Council has duly considered said Engineer's Report and the assessments proposed for the maintenance of the improvements, and finds that the Engineer's Report is sufficient and that neither said Engineer's Report, nor any part thereof, requires modification in any respect; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The City Council finds that the Engineer's Report generally describes the existing and proposed improvements and any substantial changes proposed to be made to existing improvements and indicates the general location of the district and a full and detailed description of the improvements, the boundaries of the assessment district and the zones therein, and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the district. The Engineer's Report is on file with and can be viewed at the office of the City Clerk.

2. The Engineer's Report for the maintenance of the improvements for FY 2027-28 is approved and confirmed for the Five Mile Slough Assessment District.

3. The Five Mile Slough Assessment District Engineer's Report for FY 2027-28 and the proposed FY 2027-28 budget for the Five Mile Slough Assessment District is hereby approved and confirmed. The assessments set forth in the proposed assessment roll and budget are within the assessment formula or range of assessments set forth in the Engineer's Report for the assessment district.

4. The City Council hereby accepts the balloting received and tallied by the City Clerk for the vote on the formation of the Five Mile Slough Assessment District and the associated levying of the Five Mile Slough Assessment described within the Engineer's Report, and overrules the protests submitted against this formation and levy.

5. The Five Mile Slough Assessment District shall be formed to maintain certain improvements described in the Five Mile Slough Assessment District Engineer's Report.

6. The City Council authorizes the City Clerk to prepare and submit the Five Mile Slough Assessment District assessment roll for collection in Fiscal Year 2027-2028 and subsequent years.

7. The City Council hereby authorizes the collection of the proposed assessments in Fiscal Year 2027-28 and subsequent years.

8. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
