Background

- At the January 23, 2024 Council meeting, the Council discussed Fiscal Year 2022-23 Fourth Quarter Budget results and General Fund Reserves
- Council action 2024-01-23-1501 approved an appropriation of \$4,000,000 from the General Fund for Council Priority Projects to be guided by the Budget/Finance/Economic Development Council Committee
- The Committee met on March 29, 2024, and approved a motion to recommend City Council allocate \$1 million of the \$4 million to the Stockton Shelter Navigation Center, which the Council subsequently approved on May 21, 2024
- The Committee met in May and June of 2024 to discuss potential uses of the remaining \$3 million, and approved a motion with project funding recommendations for full Council approval on June 11, 2024
