PROGRAM SNAPSHOT

2023 - 2025

- **52** organizations have gone through the program since 2023
- **93%** of alumni still apply program lessons
- A recent Cohort 1 survey found that **60%** of organizations have received over **\$100,000** in new grant funding



Added 10 new teachers and a counselor



Added 8 new staff

Added 3 new staff

KEY ALUMNI OUTCOMES

- **91%** state they lead their organizations more strategically
- **79%** maintain consistent outreach efforts
- **74%** report improved organizational recognition
- **69%** have formed new or stronger community partnerships
- **75%** report better financial practices
- **80%** now conduct regular strategic planning sessions

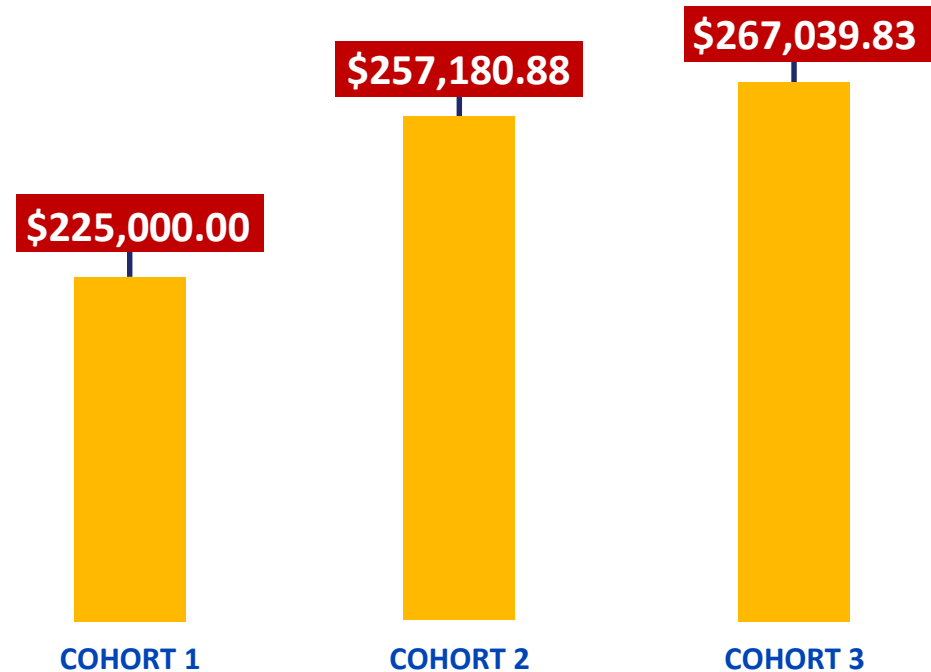




- Strengthened local nonprofit ecosystem
