RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING FUNDS AND AWARDING A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT FOR THE DOWNTOWN STOCKTON WEBER AVENUE BIKE AND PEDESTRIAN CONNECTIVITY, PROJECT NO. WT24038/ATPSB1L-5008(206)

On January 17, 2025, the City advertised a Request for Proposals (RFP) for design of the Downtown Stockton Weber Avenue Bike and Pedestrian Connectivity, Project No. WT24038/ATPSB1L-5008(206). Four proposals were received; and

The project will construct bike facilities and pedestrian improvements along Weber Avenue from Washington Street to Wilson Way. The project will also upgrade curb ramps to current Americans with Disabilities Act standards, install Class IV bike lanes, rectangular rapid flashing beacons, crosswalks, signal timing improvements, bike storage, bike lockers, public art, trees, new signage, sidewalk improvements, and curb and gutter; and

R.E.Y. Engineers, Inc. was determined to be the most qualified firm for this project. Staff negotiated a fee in the amount of \$1,412,881.13 with R.E.Y. Engineers, Inc. for design services; and

Appropriation of funds is needed to fund all design related costs to complete the project; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council approves the appropriation of funds in the amount of \$9,427,000.00 from the State Active Transportation Program to the Downtown Stockton Weber Avenue Bike and Pedestrian Connectivity, Project No. WT24038/ATPSB1L-5008(206).

2. The City Council approves findings pursuant to Stockton Municipal Code (SMC) Section 3.68.070 in support of an exception to the competitive bidding process. These findings include:

- a. The City does not have sufficient staff and expertise to design this project.
- b. Use of the RFP process is appropriate for this Professional Services Contract because it relies on the evaluation of professional qualifications and performance as the basis for selection of a vendor. Use of the criteria helps ensure selection of a vendor that will provide the highest quality professional service, which is in the public interest.

- c. The City negotiated a contract following solicitation of competitive proposals in accordance with SMC section 3.68.070.A.3.

3. The City Council awards a Professional Services Contract between the City of Stockton and R.E.Y. Engineers, Inc., in the amount of \$1,412,881.13, and the City Manager is authorized and directed to execute same, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.

4. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take whatever actions are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
