BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1) Accept this budget status report on the unaudited results of the fourth quarter of FY 2020-21.
- 2) Allocate the General Fund Vacancy Savings budget reduction for FY 2020-21 from Other Administration (Non-departmental) category to the following departments:

- 4) Authorize a reserve for future appropriation of \$2,745,000 from FY 2020-21 available funds for the estimated increase in the Assured Guaranty Settlement contingent payments.
- Authorize the transfer of unspent funds of approximately \$330,000 from the 5) Swimming Pool Evaluations project CR15013 to the Council priority projects defined in Exhibit 1.
- Authorize a FY 2021-22 appropriation of \$12,662,000 from General Fund 6) balance for Council priority projects as outlined in Exhibit 1.
- Authorize a reserve for future appropriation of \$10,200,000 from FY 2020-21 7) available funds for Council priority needs to be brought back to the City Council for allocation after review by the Council Budget/Finance/Economic Development Committee.
- Allocate available fund balance to reserve categories consistent with the 8) Council Reserve and Fund Balance Policy - General Fund Policy. The net increase in fund balance will be added to the current reserve levels to achieve the total reserve amounts as follows:
