RESOLUTION APPROVING FINDINGS AND AWARDING A \$500,000 CONTRACT TO HUBER TECHNOLOGY INC. FOR MATERIALS, ON-CALL REPAIR, AND MAINTENANCE SERVICES

During the RWCF Modifications Project, the Huber Technology Rakemax system (Rakemax) was selected to screen wastewater influent in the Headworks facility; and

The Rakemax system is a proprietary brand that requires Huber Technology parts and certified services to maintain proper operation and warranty. Consequently, Huber Technology Inc. is the sole available source for materials, on-call repair, and maintenance services; and

The Rakemax system requires routine maintenance, parts, and repair to work properly; and

The proposed contract with Huber Technology Inc. includes materials, on-call repair, and maintenance services to ensure proper maintenance of the system; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STOCKTON, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council approves the following findings pursuant to Stockton Municipal Code section 3.68.070 to support and justify an exception to the competitive bidding process:

- a. Huber Technology Inc. is the only source for Rakemax parts and repair services in the United States. Service repairs and parts are a standard maintenance practice required to preserve system operations and screening of wastewater influent.
- b. The Rakemax system was installed during the RWCF Modifications Project.
- c. The Rakemax system requires the use of original manufacturer parts and service for proper operation and lowest life-cycle cost. The use of any parts and services not supplied by Huber Technology Inc. cancels the existing warranty.
- d. The continued maintenance and repair of the Rakemax system is more cost-effective than replacing it with an alternative system and, therefore, best serves public interest.

2. The City Council authorizes the City Manager to execute a five-year contract with a not-to-exceed amount of \$500,000 with Huber Technology Inc. of Denver,

NC, for materials, on-call repair, and maintenance services, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1 and incorporated by this reference.

3. The City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to take appropriate and necessary actions to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
